59 martyred in Police Lines mosque blast

PESHAWAR: At least 59 worshipers mostly policemen were martyred, while 157 others were injured in a suicide blast inside the mosque of Malik Saad Shaheed Police Lines during the Zuhr (afternoon) prayer, on Monday.

According to security officials, the attacker was present in the front row during the prayer when he exploded himself. The explosion was so powerful that the front portion of the mosque, located in the Red Zone, was razed to the ground.

The Rescue 1122 personnel along with police continued the operation to retrieve the worshippers still trapped beneath the debris.

The KP Health Department imposed emer-

gency in all three major hospitals of Peshawar. The governor and LRH spokesman appealed to the people, particularly those having O negative blood group, to donate blood.

While talking to journalists, Commissioner Peshawar Riaz Mehsud said that there was no shortage of medicines in hospitals and rescue operation for recovery of the trapped worshippers from the mosque's debris had almost

been completed.
Capital City Police Officer (CCPO) Peshawar Muhammad Ijaz Khan told the media that it was too early to comment about the nature of the blast. However, there was the smell of explosives inside the mosque, he added while not ruling out the possibility of a

suicide attack. CCPO said that usually 300 to 400 people, including officials of the headquarters of Peshawar Police, Counter Terrorism Peshawar Police, Counter Terrorism Department, Frontier Reserve Police, Elite Force and Telecommunication departments offered Zuhr prayer at the mosque.

According to reports, the banned Tehreeke-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) had taken responsibility for the blast inside the mosque of Peshawar Police Lines.

Zardari sends legal notice to Khan

ISLAMABAD (Agencies): president and Peoples Party Pakistan (PPP) Co-Chairman Asif Ali Zardari has sent a notice to Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) Chairman Imran Khan over his remarks of an assassination plot devised by Zardari to kill him. PPP member and former chairman senate Farooq Naek delivered the notice to Imran on behalf of Zardari.

The notice urged Imran "to issue unconditional apology for his baseless remarks within 14 days or legal proceedings will be initiated against him". Earlier, Imran claimed that Zardari was behind a "plan to assassinate him after the first two bids failed. In a televised address, the former PM claimed that the PPP co-chairman had hired a terrorist outfit to have him killed after the previous attempt [in Wazirabad] on his life failed.

The PTI chief claimed that Zardari used money made through corruption in Sindh to pay a terrorist organisation to plot an attack on his life. Imran claimed that "powerful people in agencies" involved in the latest attempt, and Zardari was one of the people behind it. Without naming anyone, Imran also said another conspiracy had been hatched to have him killed by a religious extremist in the Wazirabad attack in November last year, where he sustained bullet injuries



Low turnout expected as Tunisia holds parliamentary elections

to the polls in the second round of parliamentary elections amid political and economic woes in the North African country. Polls opened and voters are choosing among 262 candidates seeking to fill the 131 remaining

In the seven constituencies with no candidate, special elections will be held later to fill the seats, likely in March. President Kais Saied sacked the government in July 2021 and froze parliament before dissolving it and changing the constitution - abolishing the hybrid parliamentary system that had been in place since 2014. Since Saied was elected president in 2019 with 72 percent of the vote, his support among Tunisians has dulled.

The first round of voting in December saw just 11.2 percent of registered voters take part and 23 candidates secured seats outright, 10 of them because they ran unopposed and 13 because they won more than 50 percent of the vote, according to election officials. Second round is seen as the final pillar of Saied's transformation of politics in the birthplace of the Arab Spring. North Korea lifted lockdown in capital

SEOUL (AP): Russia's embassy in North Korea says the country has eased stringent epidemic controls in capital Pyongyang that were placed during the past five days to slow the spread of respiratory illnesses. North Korea has not official ly acknowledged a lockdown in Pyongyang or a reemergence of COVID-19 after leader Kim Jong Un declared a widely disputed victory over the coronavirus in August, but the Russian embassy's Facebook posts have provided rare glimpses into the secretive country' infectious disease controls.

The embassy posted a notice Monday issued by North Korea's Foreign Ministry informing foreign diplomats that the "special anti-epidemic period' imposed in Pyongyang since Wednesday was lifted as of Monday. Last week the embassy said that North Korean health authorities required diplomatic missions to keep their employees indoors and also measure their temperatures four times a day and report the results to a hospital in Pyongyang. It said the North Korean measures were in response to an increase in "flu and other respiratory diseases," but it didn't mention the spread of COVID-19 or restrictions imposed on regular citizens. Shortly before that post, NK News, a North Koreafocused news website, cited a North Korean government notice to report that health officials had imposed a fivelockdown Pyongyang in an effort to stem the spread of respirato-

Getting a read of North Korea's virus situation is difficult as the country has been tightly shut since early 2020, with officials imposing strict border controls banning tourists and aid workers and jetting out diplomats while scrambling to shield their poor health care system. North Korea's admission of a COVID-19 outbreak in May last year came after it spent 2 ½ years rejecting outside offers of vaccines and other help while steadfastly claiming that its superior socialist system was protecting its population from an "evil" virus that had killed millions else-South Korea's Unification Ministry, which handles inter-Korean affairs said the number of foreign missions that are currently active in North Korea would be 10 or less, a list that includes the missions of China, Vietnam and Cuba along with the Russian embassy

He added that 70 percent of some 57,225 eligible voters had turned out to cast their ballots. Nasheed's supporters have rejected the assurances. "This primary was stolen. The support for [Nasheed] is clear here," wrote Twitter user @Mujookeynee, posting a picture of one of the former president's well-attended campaign rallies in Male.

"Election dent had won fair and square, on the back of a record of delivering on infrastructure projects, including providing safe drinking water in the Maldives' dispersed islands. UK leader fires party chief over tax bill allegations

Prime Minister Rishi Sunak fired the chairman of the governing Conservative Party for a "serious breach" of ethics rules in failing to come clean about a tax dispute. Sunak had faced days of pressure to sack Nadhim Zaĥawi amid allegations he settled a multimillion-dollar unpaid tax bill while he was in charge of the coun-

try's Treasury. The prime minister acted after a standards probe found Zahawi had breached the ministerial code of conduct. It said he had failed to disclose details of his dispute with tax authorities and the fact that he had paid a penalty. I have spoken to half a dozen doctors, all with similar stories. Overworked and underpaid, they all decided to relocate over the past two Nigerian doctors," he tells me over the years. For those left behind, the pres-

Pakistan's dormant tourism industry

AKISTAN'S Envoy to the US, Ambassador Masood Khan said that Pakistan has the most beautiful and undiscovered touristic sites with huge untapped tourism potential that needs to be realized and discovered. Ambassador Khan urged the global community and Pakistani diaspora abroad to help boost tourism in the scenic nation by investing in this potentially lucrative sector.

Pakistan is a blessed nation that enjoys a unique geography, diverse weather conditions, scenic beauty, vast untouched coastal line, and deserts, along with rich cultural heritage, and a mix of ancient and modern civilizations making the country one of the top travel destinations in the world. Unfortunately, these massive potentials could not be fully reaped by the developing nation due to a lack of investments, a partially developed tourism infrastructure, and the slackness of the ruling elite over the past decades. Pakistan's pavilion showcased the culture of all provinces of Pakistan and Azad Jammu and Kashmir, along with attractions of the ancient Ghandara civilization. In fact, Pakistan has a treasure of tourist destinations and natural beauty but we lacked suitable arrangements at most visiting sites. transport, lodging, and boarding facilities, tourist security, and an effective global campaign to attract international travelers to the country. The menace of terrorism and the unsatisfactory law and order situation had badly tarnished the image of the country at the global level and hurt foreign tourism in

The government of Pakistan has worked out various initiatives to promote tourism including the issuance of online visas with multiple extensions, the establishment of Tourist facilitation centers, a dedicated Police Force, and publicity campaigns abroad. Today, there is a dire need for a public-private partnership in the tourism industry of Pakistan and foreign investors particularly overseas Pakistanis could play an important role in branding and promoting Pakistan tourism destinations abroad. At the same time, the government needs to pour more funds into the development of state-ofthe-art tourism sites, tourist facilities, and related infrastructure, coupled with a secure and touristfriendly environment, while an incentivized tourism policy could attract foreign tourists, students, and businessmen to the country.

Pakistan needs to transform itself from a security state into a welfare and business-oriented nation. thus fundamental changes need to be introduced in its legal, banking, economic, and security regimes. so tourists, businessmen, students, and foreign citizens unhinderedly come to Pakistan, do business and enjoy leisure in the country without any fear Hence, a wholehearted approach should be adopted by government entities, private businesses, and the public to help revive tourism in the country.

CCORDING to the media, the number of evangelical Christians and preachers has mushroomed over the years in the traditionally Catholic Democratic Republic of Congo. According to the reports, opening a religious cemetery has no legal restriction or constitutional obligation and anyone could start a church, while it has become a lucrative business in Kinshasa. As said Evangelicals are on the rise while numerous Congolese evangelical leaders style themselves as archbishops and prophets, or even apostles. Many of the Bishops own television channels, preach their sect online, dressed immaculately, and roam the streets of cities.

Religious belief and spiritual rituals had always played an important role in the moral and social grooming of mankind, however, religious clerics used those divine teaching and ideas for self-promotion, and grouping for the sole purpose of dividing and ruling the followers. Emirates operates its first milestone demonstration flight

Currently, SAF is approved for use in all aircraft, but only in blends of up to 50% with conventional jet fuel.

Emirates worked alongside partners GE Aerospace, Boeing, Honeywell, Neste and Virent to procure and develop a blend of SAF that closely replicates the properties of conventional jet fuel. At each blend ratio, a host of chemical and physical fuel property

Emirates' demonstration arrived at a blending ratio that mirrored the qualities of jet fuel. Eighteen tonnes of SAF were blended, comprised of HEFA-SPK provided by Neste (hydro processed esters and fatty acids and synthetic paraffinic kerosene) and HDO-SAK from Virent (hydro deoxygenated synthetic aromatic kerosene). The 100% SAF supplied one GE90 engine, with conventional jet fuel supplying the other engine.

The test flight further demonstrates the compatibility of the specially blended SAF as a safe and reliable fuel source. 

KABUL (TOLOnews): Some residents of Kabul criticized the increase in electricity bills in the last month. They said that in the last month, every 24 hours people have electricity for only two hours, but their electricity bills have increased in comparison with other months.

We have electricity for one hour, we can't even charge our phones, we don't have power in this harsh winter, this problem covers the country, especially Kabul," said Roya, a Kabul resident.

"In the past month, we had electricity for two hours at night, we were just filling the water tank but now the electricity bill comes to 3500," said Mansoor, a Kabul resident.

Meanwhile, the former head of Da Afghanistan Breshna Sherkat said that the reason for the increasing electricity bill is the people's high use of electric energy and the estimation of the bill by the employees of Breshna company.
"There was a violation

by previous Breshna Sherkat employees; unfortunately, it's still happening now, in winter the highways are not good, and employees can't go everywhere and make bill estimates," said Amanullah Ghalib, former head of DABS.

Five of the 10 Palestinians killed were said to be armed resistance fighters, while the five others were unarmed civilians, according to residents. During the raid, Israeli forces in a military vehicle ran over and killed a 16-year-old child, according to a civil society group. A 61-year-old mother of six was also shot dead through her bedroom window after she had just finished

Palestinian officials said Israeli forces also shot at ambulance vehicles, preventing them from advancing to treat the wounded, and fired tear gas towards the Jenin public hospital that seeped into the children's ward, which Israeli officials denied was intentional. The largest Israeli military raid on the Jenin refugee camp in more than 20 years took place just before 7am (05:00 GMT). Israeli undercover forces dressed as civilians entered the camp in private vehicles with Palestinian plate numbers, surveillance

videos showed. Shortly after, they were backed up by dozens of soldiers who snuck into the camp in a large Palestinian dairy company truck. In a joint operation with Israeli intelligence and police, the army surrounded a home in the camp's Joret al-Dahab neighbourhood where three resistance fighters were taking shelter - and launched a surprise attack on it with anti-tank missiles and explosives. The house was almost completely destroyed and caught fire. The men inside it – Mohammad Soboh, 30, and brothers Nour al-Din and Mohammad Ghneim, 28 and 25 respectively - were killed.

Another fighter, Izz al-Din Salahat, 21, was shot dead up the street from the house, as he was firing back at soldiers. Armed drew, leaving behind them a trail of blood for more than a year.

A battle with resistance fighters ensued over more than 10 days, in which at least 52 Palestinian civilians and fighters, and 23 Israeli soldiers. were killed.

During that raid, the Israeli army destroyed more than 400 homes and severely damaged hundreds of others, displacing over a quarter of the population of the camp which was later rebuilt by the United Nations. "It took me back 20 years ago – to when I was a kid. This was like the invasion," 35-year-old Ahmad Mousa told Al Jazeera of Thursday's raid. The walls of his home and his car are riddled with bullet holes. "They were shooting at unarmed people, destroying property with tractors, Energa grenades," said Mousa, who shares the residence with 14 family members including seven children.

Another resident, Diana Qreini who is the mother of five children, said her home was hit with bullets from three different directions, piercing through her salon and her children's bedrooms. "I don't care about the house or myself. I care about my kids I'm just glad my kids are safe – they could have been killed," the 35-year-old said in a strained voice, attempting to hold back her tears. "Occupation soldiers shot directly at me through the window when I tried to move the curtain," she told Al Jazeera.

While policies by the Palestinian Authority and Israel after the end of the second Intifada in 2005 largely led to the dismantling of armed resistance in the occupied West Bank, fighters in Jenin began reorganising in the wake of the May 2021 popular Palestinian uprising, which begar with protests in Sheikh Jarrah in occupied East Jerusalem and saw another Israeli bombardment of the besieged Gaza Strip. As per SBP data, the domestic currency has cumulatively slumped by 14.36% or Rs38.74 in the three days, compared to Wednesday's close of Rs230.89 to a dollar, with the latest drop. In over two hours of Monday's trading session, the currency hit an intra-day low of Rs270 during the day, according to the Exchange Companies Association of Pakistan (ECAP).

Meanwhile, the association reported that the currency was changing hands with the dollar at 275 in the open market. The ECAP in its briefing mentioned that most analysts are of the view that the rupee will weaken to 275, and then consolidate towards the 270 level as IMF approves the programme.
