

AFD pledges \$55 mln to support Pakistan's Polio Program

Development Agency (AFD) has pledged \$55 million to help support Pakistan's Polio Programme operations, in efforts to interrupt poliovirus transmission.

With this the French Development Agency (AFD) has become part of global polio eradication partners with its commitment to filling the funding gap of the Government of Pakistan in its efforts to end polio. A delegation of the AFD and Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation met the Special Health Secretary and visited the National Emergency Operations Centre (NEOC) for Polio Eradication.

The meetings were part of the delegation's week-long visit to Pakistan to help support the country in the areas of health and social protection.

During a briefing at the NEOC, the AFD committed to supporting the Pakistan Polio Eradication Initiative (PEI) in immunization activities, disease surveillance, polio campaign monitoring and other technical areas, and filling the funding gap of \$55 million (under the PC-1 for polio and the multiple vaccination campaigns eradication, 2022-2026) that the programme needed.

NEOC Coordinator Dr Shahzad Baig emphasized the significance of the polio infrastructure to Pakistan's healthcare. "We are very grateful to the French Government for this support."

Programme is a vital part of our healthcare system and investing in polio is an invest-ment in the country's overall health system," he said.

He added, "The polio infrastructure has support for the most challenging of health use it for other health and emergency emergencies, like we saw with the responses post eradication.

After the NEOC meeting, Special Health Secretary Mirza Nasir ud Din Mashhood Ahmad held a debrief at the Ministry of Health and spoke about the impact on Pakistan's health infrastructure after the 2022 floods, which left 2,000 health facilities damaged.

"Despite the challenges of last year, the Government of Pakistan did not waver in its resolve to eradicate polio.

We remain committed to the cause we have held since the floods are a testament to that commitment," the Health Secretary said.





Under Section 144, gatherings banned

PESHAWAR (APP): District administrations in various districts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa have clamped section 144 to ban gathering of five or more persons for a period from March 18 to March 23, 2023.

According to an official handout, the restrictions have been imposed in the provincial capital, Bannu, Mardan, Karak, Kohat, Kurram, Dir Dir Upper, Chitral, Dir Upper d, Malakand Lower, Abbottabad, Swat and Lakki Marwat.

The notifications have been issued while keeping in view the recently issued security alert about possible terrorism.

It said that the ban on gatherings has been imposed to protect the precious lives and maintain law and order in the concerned districts and could be further extended.

In case of violation of the Section 144 of the Criminal Procedural Code (Cr.PC), the violators will face action under Section 188 of the Pakistan Penal Code (PPC).

Car crashes have killed scores of people and injured thousands in three days in Iran as the new year travel rush begins, the official news agency IRNA reported Saturday.

From Wednesday to Friday, 125 people were killed in 111 car crashes, and 2,895 others were injured in 1,171 road accidents, Ahmad Shirani, head of the Iranian Traffic Information and Control Center, was quoted by

IRNA as saying.

Shirani said the casualties were "very concerning," calling on people to be more careful in intercity trips during the celebra-tions of Nowruz, the Iranian new year, which starts on March 21 this year. The highest number of road accidents occurred

in the provinces of Khorasan Razavi, Tehran, Fars, Kerman and Isfahan, mainly due to reckless driving, speeding, and drowsy driving, Shirani added. Intercity travels often see a surge during the Nowruz holidays in Iran, raising the likeliness and occurrence of road accidents.

Nigeria **elections** 2023

ABUJA (BBC): Votes are being counted in Nigeria a day after violence and delays marred the governor and states assembly elections in some parts of the country. A few states, including Lagos, are allowing voting for a second day

Some 800 candidates are contesting the influential governor and state assemoly seats. The poll comes three

weeks after a contentious presidential election which the opposition allege was rigged in favour of the winner Bola Tinubu.

The former governor of Lagos, who was the ruling party candidate, won 37% of the vote but Atiku Abubakar and Peter Obi, the second and third-placed candidates vowed to go to court to challenge the result. While admitting there had been unanimous judgement in challenges running the 25 favour of Ruto, finding February poll, Nigeria's Independent Electoral Commission has dismissed allegations of bias. The two opposition candidates have until 31 March to

file a petition challenging the presidential results. Saturday's elections were politically motivated, say Republicans conducted in 28 of Nigeria's 36 states which were not affected by electoral disputes in previous votes. Despite the police imposing several secumeasures including restrictions on vehicle movements, numerous incidents were reported on Saturday in Lagos where some polling stations were attacked by gangs who also snatched ballot papers. inister for Information and Broadcasting Aurangzeb furiously criticized the judiciary and held it responsible for the weakness of the writ of the state. According to the Minister, the Pakistan Tahreek-e-Insaf (PTI) has turned itself into an armed group and petrol bombs were recovered from the residence of the PTI's Chief which the miscreants kept throwing on the police during the recent Police-Protestors standoff in Lahore's Zaman Park. She accused Imran Khan of considering himself above the law and playing with national interests, making conspiracies, and violating the rule of the law and the constitution. Marriyum Aurangzeb questioned whether the justice system was afraid of terrorists and petrol bombs, as a hooligan, a scoundrel comes to court with a violent crowd and he gets a bundle relief package from the court. According to her, one person cannot be allowed to attack the judiciary with a mob and get relief through aggression.

The state of Pakistan is passing through a very sensitive and critical phase of its history as the nation faces a radical social, ethnic, and political division that is deepening every other day because of the selfish politics of its leaders and the weakness of national institutions. Over the years, hypernationalism and rigid politics continuously added to already existing interparty, intersect, and communal biases in society. Meanwhile, warring political groups have ever tried to influence the government institutions in their favor through political coercion, and misuse of authority that created a sense of fear among the government servants including the Police, judiciary, and civil administration that ultimately undermine the writ of law. A series of recent events is highly condemnable, particularly the incidents at Zaman Parks, followed by a Police raid at Imran Khan's residence while PTI's Chief appearance at the courts along with a crowd of gangsters cum political workers are neither appraisable for the government nor for the opposition/ PTI. This was neither the legacy of a pro-public democratic government nor a civilized self-claimed nation reformer, rather the world commonly sees such events in gangs-controlled Haiti, and the Republic of Congo.

As for as the assertion of the government leader is concerned, the maintenance of the law and writ of the state is the responsibility of the executive and the government should not involve the judiciary in political matters and never seek an apology from the court in this regard. Meanwhile, the accused opposition leader must not create a law and order situation for the government and not harass the judges by the demonstration of political muscles and the support of an aggressive crowd. At the same time, the judges must maintain the respect, sanctity, and esteem of their valued institution with courage and conduct. The judges, lawyers, and their associates must ensure the provision of fearless and unprejudiced justice to the public in all cases even though an accused is an influential person or a powerful entity. Presently, the nation has high hopes for the judiciary to act as per the constitution without being influenced by either side, the treasury or the opposition. That is part of the reason why the UK government released this week a refreshed foreign policy strategy for the "new" era of international relations heralded by Russia's invasion of Ukraine. There are multiple developments to welcome in the document. However, it does not answer a number of growing questions concerning capability gaps that weaken UK national defense and undermine the UK's NATO contribution.

To be fair to the Rishi Sunak government, many of these questions have plagued previous Conservative administrations over the past 13 years. In 2016, for instance, Gen. Sir Richard Shirreff, who had been the UK's top commander in NATO, said that London's failure to act more prominently on the world stage has helped turned the nation into a "bit player' with "nobody taking any notice of (then-Prime Minister David Cameron risking) foreign policy irrelevance.

Looking back further in history, the challenges faced by Conservative governments in the 2010s and 2020s indicate that more than six decades after former US Secretary of State Dean Acheson famously said that the UK had lost an empire but not yet found a new world role, policy is in drift again. One of the biggest questions is how much emphasis to put on geographies such as the Asia-Pacific region versus redoubling of the Euro-Atlantic posture following Russia's invasion. As the review highlights, NATO, the EU and Europe as a geopoliti-cal space will be granted central places given that the UK's No. 1 strategic aim remains the prosperity, stability and security of the continent which, as Winston Churchill said, is where the UK's political weather comes from."

Second, the UK has evolved in the post-war period into a European regional power. This is not to deny that London remains a very significant player on the world stage, as a permanent member of key forums such as the UN Security Council, which wields considerable military, economic and soft power to boot.

One of the mistakes pro-Europeans made in the 2016 Brexit referendum was a failure to better connect a sense of the UK's importance and uniqueness to its continued membership of the EU, which amplify these strengths. Moreover, arguments that the UK should behave more like an "ordinary" nation overlook its history as a world power, and politicians who talk down one's country often suffer a public backlash.

At the same time, some have overplayed the UK's strengths, significant as these remain. Talk of the UK unlocking a new era of global trade in the 2020s has been muted by the reality of the UK's bargaining power in a world shaped by global economic superpowers including the US and China.

Ultimately, these are not just a burning issue for the UK, but also for the rest of the world. LSMI production goes up by 1.48 per cent ISLAMABAD (APP): The output of the Large Scale

Manufacturing Industries (LSMI) witnessed an increase of 1.48 per cent during January, the first month of the calendar year 2023, as compared to December 2022, the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS) reported. However, according to the provisional quantum

indices of LSMI for January 2023 released by the PBS, on a year-on-year (YoY) basis, the big industry production went down 7.90 per cent in January 2023 when compared with January 2022. Overall the LSMI showed a decline of 4.40 per cent during July-January 2022-23 when compared with the same period of last year.

The main contributors towards overall negative growth of 4.40 per cent were food (0.32%), tobacco (0.55%), textile (2.71%) garments (3.81%), petroleum products (0.69%), cement (0.86), pharmaceuticals 1.22%), and automobiles (1.55%).

The production in July-January 2022-23 as compared to the same period of the corresponding year has increased in wearing apparel (44.47%), leather products (4.98%), furniture (73.80%), and other manufacturing (48.26%). The provisional quantum indices of LSMI for January 2023 with the base year 2015-16 have been developed based on the latest data supplied by the source agencies, including the Oil Companies Advisory Committee, Ministry of Industries and Production, Ministry of Commerce and Provincial Bureaux of Statistics (BoS).

INDIAN WELLS (AP) Carlos Alcaraz defeated Jannik Sinner 7-6 (4), 6-3 on Saturday to advance to the BNP Paribas Open final against Daniil Medvedev.

Medvedev beat Frances Tiafoe 7-5, 7-6 (4) on his eighth match point for his 19th consecutive match victory of the year. alties reported in 2021 were due to unexploded bomb fragments, while more than 79% were children in the same year.

Many people, primarily children, are killed and injured yearly in explosions caused by unexploded bombs left over from the four decades of wars and civil conflicts, making Afghanistan one of the most mine-contaminated countries in the world.

India launches mercenary cyber-attacks on Khalistan Referendum voting in Australia

BRISBANE (APP): More than 11,000 first time that the Indian state had done voting in Melbourne at the end of Khalistan Referendum voting at the Brisbane Convention and Exhibition Centre amid a massive wave of Indian cyber security mercenary attacks on the electronic voting machines.
