#### Fazl asks PM to recall Pak envoy from Sweden

Ulema-e-Islam (Fazl) chair-Maulana Fazlur Rehman on Friday demanded Prime Minister (PM) Shehbaz Sharif to recall Pakistan ambassador from Sweden in protest against the desecration of Holy Quran.

Movement (PDM) president made this demand during a telephonic conversation with PM Shehbaz Sharif. During the conversation, Maulana Fazl noted that all Muslim nations, including Pakistan, should recall their ambassadors from Sweden.

It is pertinent to mention here that Iraq - day earlier expelled the Swedish ambassador in protest at a planned desecration of Holy Quran in Stockholm that had prompted hundreds of protesters to storm and set alight the Swedish embassy. An Iraqi government statement added that Baghdad was also recalling its charge d'affaires in Sweden, and Iraq's state news agency reported that Iraq had suspended the working permit of Sweden's Ericsson on Iraqi soil.

ISLAMABAD: Federal Minister for Finance and Revenue, Senator Mohammad Ishaq Dar on Friday firmly denied media reports claiming the imposition of additional taxes on agriculture and real estate sectors to meet the International Monetary Fund's (IMF) requirements.

"I am categorically announcing on the floor of the house that there will be no new taxes on agriculture and real estate. We have faced numerous hardships due to the International Monetary Fund (IMF) requirements, and we have diligently met all the prior actions," the finance minister said while speaking at the National Assembly. The minister further emphasized that the news was entirely baseless and lacked truth, clarfying that all fiscal decisions made by the government were aimed at fulfilling IMF's requirements and commit-

Senator Ishaq Dar also offered his readiness to provide detailed information on these specific issues to anyone seeking clarification. Discussing the economic situation, the finance minister mentioned that if the government continued its present policies, the inflation rate was expected to decrease to 7 per cent, based on the working of the

State Bank. Attributing the country's economic hardships to Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf's backtracking from commitments, Senator Dar proudly stated that with the government's efforts, Pakistan had successfully reached an agreement of \$3 billion with the IMF. As a result, the State Bank of Pakistan received the first tranche of \$1.2 billion to stabilize the economy.

Speaking on the current foreign exchange reserves, he informed that the reserves had reached their highest position since October 2022. Islamabad airport set for 15-year outsourcing to enhance operational activities: Minister for Aviation Khawaja Saad Rafique said that Islamabad International Airport would be outsourced for a period of 15 years to improve its operational activities.

In response to a calling attention notice in National Assembly sponsored by MMA lawmaker Maulana Abdul Akbar Chitrali regarding the outsourcing of the airport, the minister clarified that the move does not equate to privatization. Instead, it aims to bring in proficient operators to enhance airport operations, he said. Khawaja Saad Rafique emphasized that open competitive bidding would be ensured, allowing the best bidder to be given the opportunity to operate the airport. The process, he said will be profit-oriented, ultimately benefiting the national exchequer. The International Finance Corporation will serve as the consultshown interest in participating in the bidding process, he added. The minister assured that the process would be

would not be included in the outsourcing process. Highlighting the success of outsourced airports in other countries like India and Turkiye, Khawaja Saad Rafique mentioned that even Madina airport has been efficiently outsourced to deliver enhanced servic-

The minister also stressed the need to restructure Pakistan International Airlines (PIA) to address its substantial deficit, which has reached Rs. 80 billion this year and is projected to increase to Rs. 259 billion by 2030 if not dealt with appropriately. He asserted that no employees would be laid off, and all existing staff would retain their job security and privileges. However, he also mentioned that best practices would be implemented to ensure facilities at airports are efficiently man-

Regarding the future plans for PIA, Khawaja Saad Rafique informed that the total liability of PIA amounts to Rs. 742 billion, with only 27-28 planes currently operational. He urged the necessity to save the institution and underscored the importance of the restructuring legislation, which has been approved by the National Assembly in the previous sitting. To address the deficit, the minister revealed plans to restore flights to the UK within three months, followed by the resumption of flights to the US and Europe.

Khawaja Saad Rafique issued a warning that immediate reforms were crucial to prevent further escalation of the deficit in the coming days. He acknowledged that a statement from a former federal minister for Aviation had created problems for PIA. However, he assured that all audits and tests have been successfully cleared, ant, and already 12-13 companies have demonstrating the government's commitment to transparency and accountability. #### Six dead, 1053 injured in 1027 crashes in Punjab

LAHORE (APP): At least six persons were dead and 1,053 injured in 1,027 road traffic crashes (RTCs) in all 37 districts of Punjab during the last 24 hours.

Out of these, 557 people with serious injuries were shifted to different hospitals, while 496 victims with minor injuries were treated at the incident site by Rescue Medical Teams thus reducing the burden of hospitals, said a spokesperson for Rescue-1122.

Around 536 drivers, 38 underage drivers, 141 pedestrians, and 382 passengers were among the victims of road traffic crashes, he said and added that 272 RTCs were reported in Lahore which affected 286 persons placing the provincial capital at top of the list followed by 63 in Faisalabad with 59 victims and at third Multan with 62 RTCs and 51 victims.

According to the data 873 motorbikes, 67 autorickshaws, 105 motorcars, 23 vans, 13 passenger buses, 29 trucks and 82 other types of auto vehicles and slow-moving carts were involved in these road traffic accidents, he added.

The driver of the trailer has been arrested by the police. The bodies of the deceased have been handed over to their family for burial. The police have registered a case and are investigating the matter. The accident has once again highlighted the need for increased vigilance and safety measures on the motorways.

#### Four wounded in vehicle blast F.P. Report



### Strong winds reignite fire near Athens as heatwave sears Greece

ATHENS (Agencies): Firefighters in Greece are battling a reignited wildfire that has triggered a series of new evacuations, as authorities braced for more of the extreme weather that has brought searing temperatures across southern Europe. Authorities had declared the wildfire contained overnight but firefighters lost control when the winds gathered strength.

'It's day four of these wildfires; they had contained the flames and then as the afternoon progressed, the wind picked up again and that's when the reigniting of fires happened," Al Jazeera's Stefanie Dekker, reporting from near the smouldering ruins of a chemical plant in Voiotia, said. The huge fire has already burned 35 square kilometres (13.5 square miles) of forest and scrubland. In his latest news briefing, Fire Service spokesman Yiannis Artopoios said there had been 62 forest fires across Greece over the previous 24 hours. He added the extreme weather conditions were creating "dynamic fire fronts", noting that authorities had issued evacuation orders for several areas across West Attica.

Then it went away, and we got another [one] this week, which they called the Charon new heatwave," he added. Hannah Cloke, a climate scientist also at the University of Reading, described what the phenomenon feels like. "The bubble of hot air that has inflated over Southern Europe has turned Italy and surrounding countries into a giant pizza oven," she said in a statement. "The hot air, which pushed in from Africa, is now staying put with settled high-pressure conditions meaning that heat in warm sea, er heat wave and a possible strengthening of the winds. #### Attacks on Ukraine ports flayed

(Reuters): UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres condemned strongly attacks on Russian Ukraine's Black Sea ports and warned the "destruction of civilian infrastructure may constitute a violaof international humanitarian law." "These attacks are also having an impact well beyond Ukraine," said UN spokesperson Stephane Dujarric. "We are already seeing the negative effect on global wheat and corn prices which hurts everyone, but especially vulnerable people in the global

Russia has jolted world grain markets with an escalation in the Black Sea, mounting a third-straight night of air strikes on Ukrainian ports and issuing a threat against Ukrainevessels. responded by announcing similar measures against vessels bound for Russia or Russian-occupied Ukrainian territory. Moscow has described the port attacks as revenge for a Ukrainian strike on Russia's bridge to Crimea. The moves came just days after Russia quit a - brokered by the United Nations and Turkey that allowed the safe Black Sea export of Ukraine grain for the past

Security Council will meet on Friday over the "humanitarian consequences" of Russia's withdrawal from the Black Sea deal, Britain's U.N mission said. Russia's withdrawal also effectively ended a pact between the UN and Moscow, in which UN officials agreed to help Russian food and fertilizer exports world markets. Under that agreement, the UN has said Moscow was no longer fulfilling a pledge to "facilitate the unimpeded export of food, sunflower oil, and fertilizers" from Ukrainian Black Sea Ports. The United Nations said that Russia's attacks on Ukrainian ports also contradict that commitment. #### **US** plans second summit

WASHINGTON (Reuters) US President Joe Biden will host a second summit with leaders of Pacific island nations in September, Joseph Yun, the US official responsible to negotiations with three key Pacific island states said. US officials have said the summit is expected to take place around the time of the UN General Assembly meetings in New York in

September. Biden's national security adviser, Jake Sullivan, said in May Biden would arrange another summit of Pacific island leaders this year after the disappointment caused by his cancellation of a visit to Papua New Guinea due to the domestic debt ceiling crisis. Biden hosted a first summit with the leaders last year. 'He has committed (to) holding a second summit in September this year," Yun told an event hosted by the Heritage Foundation think tank. Yun stressed the importance of the US Congress approving new funding for the three Pacific Island countries he has been negotiating with by the end of the fiscal year on Sept. 30, given China's strategic ambitions in

"Thanks to them, people lived at ease," he added, describing how the wind catchers pull fresh air into buildings and allow hot air to ventilate out through large vertical slots. 'Unfortunately, our ancestral heritage has been forgotten," especially since the emergence of air conditioners, said Oloumi. Yazd's old town is a labyrinth of narrow streets and roofed alleyways. Its centuriesold edifices made of clay, mud-brick and adobe all provide insulation against the torrid heat.

But the old houses stand in sharp conture imitates that in other countries, and cement-based construction does not correspond to the climate of Yazd," he added. Kamaraji says bioclimatic architecture has waned due to economic constraints and modern construction methods that "largely favour the use of energy and fossil fuel intensive materials". Another sustainable architectural feature of Yazd is its system of underground aqueducts called qanats, which transport water from underground wells, aquifers or the mountains. "These towering 33-metre (100 foot) wind catcher underground aqueducts have great utility, said Zohreh Montazer, an expert on the water system. "They constitute a source of water supply and make it possible to cool the dwellings and to preserve food at an ideal temperature." Iran is estimated to have around 33,000 operational quants today, a significant drop from the 50,000 in use in the mid-20th century.

UNESCO says the decline in qunats is driven in part by the drying up of underground water sources due to overconsumption. #### Pakistan's IT sector, prospects and limitations

RIME Minister Shehbaz Sharif has recentstressed the need to increase the Country's IT exports to \$25 billion, coincidence with an investment of over \$20 billion in the same field within the next two to three years. While speaking at a seminar on Information Technology, the Premier noted that the coalition government has already developed a mechanism to ensure a one-window operation to facilitate foreign and local investors. According to him, Pakistan was rich with immense youth potential and its \$2.5 billion exports did not justify the national capacity, while Pakistan's Eastern neighbor excelled in the IT Sector, and Pakistan was positioned to claim its place.

Information Technology has been largely ignored by successive Pakistani governments in the past that adversely affected Pakistan's overall economic growth by pushing the South Asian economy to the last numbers in the region. Pakistan's IT sector grew from scratch due to the digitalization drive of government institutions which attracted foreign firms that brought basic IT infrastructure and technical expertise in the country. Awfully, Pakistani leaders always sought to promote their business interests through nepotism and cartelization in various fields which resulted in unsustainable growth and concentration of wealth in a limited circle of the society. The same happened in the poultry industry, solar energy, and some IT Projects in the country. On the other India timely accessed the importance of Information Technology and welcomed American Tech giants to its nation in the mid 90s. Over the year, India became the world's second largest hub of IT industry and currently ranked as the 40th most developed IT nation with an average revenue of \$ 245 billion per annum. This is the reason that India generates more revenue from its IT exports than Saudi Arabia earns through the trade of black gold.

According to the statistics, Pakistan's IT sector is currently well established and Pakistani IT startups have expertise in the creation of high-end, system integration, mobile apps, gaming, medical transcription, enterprise-grade software development, telemarketing, and other important software developments and tech services.

Pakistan's IT industry had grown rapidly with a rate of 18% per annum over the past few years and is expected to reach \$7 billion by 2023. Currently, Pakistan's IT industry is based in Karachi, Lahore, and Islamabad and a pool of over three hundred thousand young IT professionals is the key driver of this magnificent sector. The government has started special initiatives including the constitution of the Special Investment Facilitation Council (SIFC), the Digiskill training program, and other endeavors to attract foreign investors, encourage local youth and young entrepreneurs to make their future in this industry. At the same time, young Pakistani IT Professionals, entrepreneurs, and freelancers are making history through their active contribution toward the economic revival of the country. Currently, over 60% of youth out of the 220 million strong Pakistani nation is the real hope of the country, which will contribute immensely toward the promotion of the IT sector and economic revival of the country if they trained and utilized sufficiently. The incumbent coalition government has made significant endeavors to develop IT infrastructure and boost IT exports in the country. As said, several Gulf countries are willing to invest in Pakistan to mutually harvest the tremendous untapped potential in the IT sector. Meanwhile, a one-window operation has been launched by the government to facilitate potential investors without any delay.

## Why Russia wants Syria's Bab Al-Hawa crossing closed

### Shipping industry underwhelms with vague new green targets

#### Chelsea striker joins Marseille

LONDON (BBC): Marseille have signed Chelsea striker Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang. ### Beauty salon ban in Afghanistan a blow to women's financial freedom

KABUL (Reuters): For the last eight years, Marzia Reyazee has supported her family with the earnings from her female-only beauty salon in Afghanistan, a business she spent more than \$18,000 setting up.

But the 34-year-old mother of two is likely to find herself without her business, and with few other prospects for a livelihood, when the Taliban administration's order to shutter women's beauty salons comes into effect on July 25. "We can't work here, we can't feed our family, we need to work," she said. Like many women in Afghanistan's beauty services sector, Reyazee is the main breadwinner in the family. ### Mily trials: AGP seeks a month's time on matter of right to appeal

ISLAMABAD (Agencies): Attorney General for Pakistan (AGP) Mansoor Usman Awan on Friday requested the Supreme Court for a month on the matter of granting the right of appeal to people to be tried in military

"This matter needs very careful consideration; It has to be done in such a way that the country's position at the global level is not affected," the AGP said. The AGP's request came during a hearing of identical petitions challenging the government's decision to conduct trials of civilians in military courts.

The six-member bench comprising Chief Justice of Pakistan Umar Ata Bandial, Justice Ijazul Ahsan, Justice Munib Akhtar, Justice Yahya Afridi, Justice Sayyed Mazahar Ali Akbar Naqvi and Justice Ayesha Malik.

At the start of the hearing, AGP Awan took to the rostrum and reiterated the need for military courts. He also assured the bench that arrests were made very carefully after a thorough investigation. He further contended that according to the Army Act, those breaking the discipline of civilian forces came under the law. court on the amendments to the Army

#### CJ accepts govt's plea seeking withdrawal of curative review against Justice Isa

SLAMABAD (Agencies): Chief Justice of Pakistan (CJP) Umar Ata Bandial has approved the federal government's petition seeking the withrawal of a curative review filed by previous Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI)ed government against Senior Puisne Judge Qazi Faez Isa.

CJP Bandial had reserved the verdict on the federal government's plea arlier in April this year. The CJP disposed of the petition on the basis of vithdrawal, according to the verdict announced on Friday. The Pakistan Democratic Movement (PDM)-led government had requested the apex court withdraw the curative review petition filed against Justice Isa.

Dubbing it an act of state-led vengeance by the former PTI-led regime, the ncumbent government of Pakistan Democratic Movement (PDM) said that wants to withdraw the appeal filed against the judgment of the country's op court. The police JIT concluded its investigation into the May 9 violent incidents holding the former prime "responsible" minister Special Prosecutor Sarhad Ali Shah maintained that the investigators found the chief "guilty" According to the report pre-pared by the JIT, the accused nominated in case 23/96 for attacking Jinnah House including PTI chief were all "guilty<sup>;</sup>

The report says the 'planning and execution' of the attack on Jinnah House by the accused has established. been According to the JIT investigation, Jinnah House storming and all the other May 9 incidents were carried out as "planned". The JIT detectives based their findings on the thorough analysis of digital evidence, mobile videos, closed-circuit footage and cellphone

contacts. The report also finds the statement of Imran Khan recorded before the JIT as entirely contrary to the evidence. The statements of other PTI leaders given to the JIT also went against the facts, the report adds. The JIT probe report maintains that the contacts between PTI leaders and the rioters were proved through mobile calls record. The PTI leaders could not utter "appropriate responses" to the questions raised by police investiga-tors in light of the digital and forensic evidence, the police said.

#### LPG sellers call for strike F.P. Report

LAHORE: A day after petroleum dealers announced strike, sellers of liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) on Friday also called for a countrywide strike against the sale of the commodity at 'expen-

sive prices'. In a statement, Chairman LPG Industries Association Karachi Irfan Khokhar said that the distributors will observe a shutter down strike across the country from August 5. Khokhar pointed out that LPG was not being sold anywhere in the country at the fixed official price, adding that due to black marketeering, the gas is being sold at higher prices.

He alleged that top officers of SSGC were behind the sale of 'expensive gas' He added that the price per kg is Rs178, but LPG was being sold at Rs220 to Rs350 per kg, announcing to move court against it. The announcement comes just a day after petroleum dealers in Pakistan announced an indefinite strike, starting from July 22 (Saturday) According to the official notice issued by PPDA Chairman Abdul Sami Khan, the association demanded the government to increase the distributors' commission.
