Govt raised PoL prices ignoring 'political cost'

ISLAMABAD: Federal Minister for Information and Broadcasting Marriyum Aurangzeb Tuesday said the incumbent government had responsibly managed the agreement with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and taken decisions to raise petroleum product prices ignoring "political cost". On the contrary, the previous regime

violated the agreement with the IMF just for political gains, she said while addressing a news conference after inauguration of the Foreign Media Digital Wall of Digital Electronic Media Unit here at the Directorate of Electronic Media and Publications. The government's tenure will end in a

few days, but we have prioritized the state over politics. In contrast, Imran Khan, who was certain about end of his government, subsidized petroleum products and violated the IMF agreement which inflicted massive damage to economy," she maintained. The minister said that the present coalition government did not take decisions for petty political advantages, rather the same were made in the larger national interest.

She said about 15 months ago the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) and allied parties decided to save the country (from the clutches of an inefficient ruler). "Today we can hold our heads high and say that the government took the decisions for the stability of the country's economy," she maintained.

When the present government came to power, Pakistan was on the verge of bankruptcy, she said, adding the inefficient and incompetent rulers of the past had brought the country on the brink of default for getting political mileage. After taking the charge of office, she said, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif restarted talks to revive the suspended IMF programme to save the country's reputation. The present government not only removed the "economic mines" planted by the last regime, but put the country on the road of development.

The minister mentioned that there were various reasons for recent increase in the petroleum product prices, including global market fluctuations as well as commitments made to the IMF. She said it would have been easy for the government to reduce petroleum prices for political gains, but priority was given to the economy and state. The Chinese Vice Premier's visit to Pakistan showed confidence reposed by the world in Pakistan under the leadership of Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, she

2 policemen protecting polio team martyred

QUETTA (PPI): Two policemen were martyred in an attack on a police vaccination team in Quetta on Tuesday. The deceased cops were accompanying the polio vaccinators in Nawan Kalli area of the Balochistan capital when they were fired upon. The two policemen were identified as Shaukat Ali and Syed Mehdi.

The polio team was reported to be safe in the gun attack. A heavy contingent of police and FC personnel rushed to the site of the incident and cordoned off the area. Two to three policemen are posted with every polio team as part of the security measures in view of the rising threat against polio workers.

The attack came when a campaign was under way to administer polio vaccination to approximately 2.6 million children under five years of age across Balochistan. As many as 11,539 teams of health workers have been formed for the week-long campaign.

Two Indians found dead

KASUR (PPI): Two Indian youth, swept by flooding Sutlej River water, landed in Pakistan from India, according to a report on Tuesday. Paramilitary Rangers arrested two young men of Ludhiana in India, who were swept by Sutlej flood water and stranded at Ganda Singh Wala across the border in Pakistan.

Arrested youth have been identified as Ratan Pal and Harvinder Sindh. Another person, drifted by the river water had earlier reached Pakistan, who is yet to be identified. India had recently rel-

eased over 2,00,000 cusecs water to Sutlej downstream in Pakistan after persistent rains in the catchment areas of the river. The country had discharged water from Harike and Ferozepur waterworks in River Sutlej to the downstream areas. It was in 1988 that Pakistan had witnessed worst flooding in the two eastern rivers - Ravi and Sutlej - which had devastated crops and livelihoods over thousands of acres.

CHITRAL: The devastating flood that occurred on July 22 had changed the map of Chitral. The level of the flood was so high that the water was flowing five feet above the river, which resulted in the loss of surrounding houses, shops, markets, workshops, standing crops, under cultivation land, orchards and fields. Due to the flood, irrigation and drinking water pipeline and canals were also flowed.

The drinking water pipeline, which costs about Rs 400 Million from Golden, is being destroyed every year due to the department lacks technical honesty and dedication with their job. Even when the pipeline was constructed, our team surveyed it and demanded the Public Health Engineering still blocked. The widely advertised Gwadar deep water port, and huge road infrastructure still await movement of convoys running between Chinese border regions and Pakistani warm water ports of Gwadar and Karachi, prolonged electricity shortages still exists despite completion of several energy projects under the CPEC, Special Economic Zones (SEZs) are not operationalized that might realize the dream of an economic and industrial revival in a crisis hit nation if implemented in true letter and spirit.

After a decade-long journey, the CPEC has entered its second phase with the completion of preliminary road, energy and industrial infrastructure, while our Chinese friends and Pakistani political and military leadership predict the unimaginable outcome of the ongoing development schemes under the CPEC. The western think tanks commonly term the massive Chinese investment a debt trap and spreading poisonous propaganda against the CPEC unceasingly. Relentless western conspiracy and uncertain situations on the ground cast serious doubts among the masses regarding the future of the CPEC projects in the country. Amid doubts and apprehensions, the unflinching faith of Pakistani leaders and repeated assurances from the Chinese leadership regarding continued support and backing for Pakistan are the ray of hope for the poor Pakistanis, who have currently left nothing to scarify except their lives.

the Central Committee of the Chinese Communist Party jointly issued a statement titled, "Opinions on Promoting the Development and Growth of the Private Economy." guidelines aimed at building a more friendly environment for private businesses, which have suffered from years of pandemic restrictions and lackluster foreign sales. On July 24, the National Development and Reform Commission, China's macroeconomic policymaker, followed up with a "Circular on Further Efforts to Promote Private Investment in an Effort to Mobilize Private Investments." This document pledged to make the private economy "bigger, better and stronger" and to cultivate a "close and clean" relationship between businesses and the government. After decades of rapid growth, private investment in China has leveled out in recent years, recording an increase of just 0.9% in 2022 and a decline of 0.2% in the first half of 2023, according to the Chinese news website, Caixin. 


