Chief Minister discusses financial problems of public universities



Afghanistan's quest for economic revival

The Taliban interim government is currently pushing hard to build the Afghan economy through domestic talent and resources to achieve at least self-sustainability if it cannot attain self-sufficiency. The Afghan incumbent government could not bridge the gap between itself and the international community to end the diplomatic and trade isolation rather there had been a significant distraction with the neighbours including Pakistan that caused a blow to the Afghan economy in respect of bilateral and transit trade. Presently, Afghan officials are overseeing the construction of dams and canals to boost agriculture and tunnels to connect remote provinces. Steel mills work through the night to churn out red-glowing, heavy beams for infrastructure projects. The Talibanrun government's ambitions are driven by necessity and are mostly being fulfilled by relying on domestic revenue to finance development projects, however economic challenges and no technical and financial support from abroad severely hinder the pace of construction work and development initiatives.

The war-torn Afghanistan faces a multitude of interconnected social and economic issues due to decades of conflict, instability, and underdevelopment. Prolonged conflict has resulted in massive internal displacement and millions of Afghans have taken refuge abroad in other countries including Pakistan, Iran, Turkey, etc since the violence erupted in the early eighties. Presently, Afghanistan's population faces widespread poverty, unemployment, limited economic opportunities, and least commercial activities, while returnees from neighbouring countries further exacerbate social issues and contribute to instability. Meanwhile, lack of essential infrastructure, and inadequate access to basic services such as clean water, electricity, and transportation, slows down the efforts for socio-economic development and integration. Persistent security threats, issues relating to human and women's rights, and a ban on girls' education impede the delivery of urgently needed foreign humanitarian assistance adding to the public's woes hindering the development efforts, and weakening people's confidence in the government.

Although, addressing these issues is the top priority of the Afghan rulers, but it requires a lot of resources and a comprehensive approach involving not only the immediate restoration of foreign humanitarian aid but also longterm strategies focusing on sustainable development. education, healthcare, infrastructure rebuilding, employment generation, and promoting peace and stability with in the country. Nation-building in landlocked Afghanistan involves a complex set of challenges due to its geographical constraints, prolonged violence, and political instability, along with the prevailing social, political, and security dynamics within the country. All those issues and ailments merit a multifaceted approach from the Afghan interim government that encompasses measures to restore political stability through inclusive governance, social cohesion, and regional cooperation with neighbouring countries as well as global partners to boost bilateral trade and cooperation.

So far, all these proven strategies are not available to Afghan interim leaders to steer their nation toward economic development, industrial growth, and social prosperity. The global community does not recognize the Taliban government, the US has confiscated their funds, local political groups are apprehensive about their intentions, and neighbours are not on friendly terms with them. The People's Republic of China (PRC) is currently assisting the Islamic Emirates and Chinese firms have invested significantly in energy and infrastructure projects yet continuity and completion of those projects is very crucial.

Afghan leaders mistakenly picked up their political agenda in the first go instead of initiating a campaign for nation-building, thus opposing political inclusiveness. restricting women's freedom, and imposing a ban on girls education created big hurdles to their vision for political stability, economic progress and growth. Although, the agenda of interim Afghan rulers is not very difficult yet their strategy abstains from fundamental elements that are crucial to grasping the idea of industrial revival and economic selfsufficiency. However, the pros and cons of their statesmanship and legacy will be evident in the future.

Multilateral cooperation must not fall by the wayside

In 2021, I noted that the shape and pace of the post-pandemic ecoeconomy, which has yet to bounce back fully from the pandemic, faces a new source of risk: proliferating geopolitical conflicts. Over the last two years, the war in Ukraine, the Israel-Hamas war and seven military coups in sub-Saharan Africa have increased fragility and displaced huge numbers of people.

And yet, despite conditions that require strengthening collective action, multilateral cooperation appears to be in decline. We are not on track to meet the Sustainable Development Goal of ending extreme poverty by 2030, when an estimated 7 percent of the world's population will still be living in penury if current trends continue. Moreover, climate disasters are becoming more common — a dangerous and worsening trend. Discouragingly, there is a lack of global leadership in tackling these existential threats to humanity. It would do us well to acknowledge this reality and then decide how to change it.

crises, there is good news. The world economy has shown resilience in 2023, despite the slow and uneven recovery since the pandemic. The fight against stubbornly high global inflation seems to be working: inflation is projected to fall steadily from 8.7 percent in 2022 to 6.9 percent in 2023 and 5.8 percent in 2024. This can be attributed to interest rate hikes and lower international commodity prices, although prolonged mone-tary tightening will slow global economic activity. Meanwhile, gross domestic product growth in some emerging markets and developing economies, especialy in East Asia and the

Moreover, at the International Monetary Fund and World Bank annual meetings in Marrakech in October, finance ministers and central bank governors agreed on eight global challenges to be tackled together and endorsed the World Bank's new vision and mission to create a world free of poverty and to boost shared prosperity on a livable planet. This goal underpins the World Bank's new playbook for development, as well as its enhanced financing model, ensuring that our collective effort to combat global challenges is feasible and strategically sound. There are three main

threats to global growth prospects over the medium term: escalating geopolitical tensions, which could lead to economic fragmentation; technological decoupling, which could prevent the diffusion of new digital technologies to boost productivity; and climate change, particularly its impact on agriculture. Unfortunately, many countries have limited policy space to support economic growth. Monetary policy has become largely restrictive to contain inflationary pressure, while fiscal policy is increasingly constrained, especially in low-income developing countries facing debt distress and the twin challenges of food and energy insecurity.

Geopolitical competition and conflict threaten to undo the gains of globalization. For the last 30 years, crossborder trade and investment have tripled the size of the global economy and lifted 1.3 billion people out of poverty. But today, new wars and simmering tensions could unravel supply chains, halt investment flows, give rise to multiple competing international standards for critical and emerging digital technologies, and lead to greater income and wealth inequalities.

To counter the threat from geopolitics, we must emphasize the importance of rulesbased multilateral cooperation that values transparency, certainty and shared prosperity. Concerted collective effort is required to resist fragmentation on all fronts. After all, a breakdown in integration could lead to a sustained increase

The rapid development of digital technologies, if properly managed, could thus be a boon for sustained economic recovery. We can unite around a common Even amid overlapping strategy to increase their adoption and prevent fragmentation by ensuring that we account for complementary factors such as skill endowments, regulatory issues and competition levels.

Finally, it has become clear that the impact of climate change on agriculture will worsen global inequalities. In the first half of 2022, we witnessed one of the largest shocks to global food markets in decades, partly owing to poor harvests resulting from extreme weather events. Given the rifts and disparities that confront the international community today, strengthening multilateral cooperation is more important than ever. We must strengthen the spirit of solidarity, multilateralism and collaboration to pave the way for peaceful conflict resolution and economic cooperation. We must provide well-targeted fiscal support and more robust debtmanagement mechanisms. particularly for vulnerable countries. We must design policy responses to the current high interest rate environment that balance stability with growth. And we must ensure long-term growth sustainability through comprehensive structural reforms and investment in a green global economy.

Monitoring and mitigating potential systemic threats are crucial for economic stability. Now and in the coming years, the actions we take — both globally and locally — will determine whether we rise to the pressing international challenges or fall victim to them. Sheikh Nawaf Al-Ahmad Al-Sabah, who took the reins in 2020 after the death of his half-brother, Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Sabah, passed away last Saturday. The Gulf country's new emir, Sheikh Mishal Al-Ahmad emir, Al-Sabah, took the oath of office on Wednesday.

Kuwait's distinctive foreign policy has been closely associated with the years-long leadership of Sheikh Sabah. (APBF) has observed that the inflation measured by the Sensitive Price Indicator (SPI) continued to rise in the wake of higher prices of food and energy despite recent cut in the prices of petroleum products, as essential commodities have still not seen a decline in prices, leaving trade and industry frustrated.

APBF President Syed from Maaz Mahmood, quoting the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS), observed that the index spiked 38.28 percent when compared with the corresponding week of last year, as out of the 51 essential commodities covered by SPI, prices of 17 (33.33 percent) items increased, rates of another 17 decreased and prices of the remaining 17 items remained unchanged compared to the previous

On a weekly basis, the price of tomato rose 6.28 percent, egg 3.48 percent, powdered salt 2.75 percent, cooked beef 1.06 percent, garlic 1.04 percent, tea (prepared) 0.73 percent, beef 0.39 percent and potato 0.35 percent.

Curran loses appeal against 4-match ban

SYDENY (Agencies): Sydney Sixers all-rounder Tom Curran said he "deeply regrets" the incident which resulted in him receiving a four-match ban for intimidating an umpire.

Cricket Australia found that Curran was involved in a disagreement with an umpire during the warm-up before a Big Bash game against Hobart Hurricanes.

The 28-year-old England player lost an appeal against his punishment. "I have had a lot of time to reflect on my actions and the incident," said Curran. 'My preparation for every fixture is deeply methodical and my focus is intense during the warm-up.

"Part of my preparation is to do a run through and gauge my run up on that particular surface. I've done this before every match and for me it's part of my routine for every match.

"The interaction with Muhammad umpire Qureshi took me by surprise at a time when I was very focused on my prematch routine. I didn't the stand-off that resulted. "I deeply regret the way I reacted to it and the resultant impact for umpire Qureshi, the Sydney Sixers and myself personally." In the build-up to the match on 11 December, the fourth umpire - who is tasked with supervising the pitch - asked Curran not to run on the pitch.

But CA's code of conduct commissioner Adrian Anderson found Curran then "attempted to perform a practice run-up and run at pace straight towards the umpire, who stood in the bowling crease facing Curran. The umpire stepped to his right to avoid the risk of collision".

The incident deemed to be "intimidation or attempted intimidation of an umpire or match referee" under the CA code.

According to the BBL's rules, only the captain and team coach are permitted to walk on the pitch to assess its condition prior to the start of play, with spiked footwear also not allowed before the match. "My intention was always to veer off to umpire Qureshi's right, in a similar way to my run up at the other end, added Curran.

Historically, Pakistan Railways charged Rs. 100,000 per track crossing for 10 years when telecom operators installed fibre broadband, sources in the Ministry told APP. In 2007, they said the charges were increased to Rs. 2.7 million for five years, as the use of fibre broadband expanded. However, in 2022, the PTI-led government reduced the crossing charges to Rs. 600,000 per crossing for a lifetime to promote fibre broadband.

They said that in contrast, cable TV operators continue to pay only Rs. 100 per year. Concerns over air pollution increased

The National Environmental Protection Agency (NEPA) says over the past month, the air quality in Kabul city has deteriorated

and become more polluted. NEPA officials said that the lack of electricity, extensive use of unrefined coal and burning of plastic are major factors of air pollution in the capital.

'Air pollution has various causes. Damaged roads, the wide spread of dust and the use of vehicles that have technical prob-lems, pollute the air," said Sayed Qayyum Hashemi, an expert at NEPA.

Hashemi added that teams from this department are checking buildings and residential areas to make sure homes with burners have filters installed.

'Install filters and always keep filters active and where necessary and where possible, we encourage the commercial sector to use alternative fuels," he said.

The Ministry of Public Health's spokesman Sharaf Zaman also said that the number of people suffering from respiratory diseases due to air pollution is increasing in the country.

Kabul residents meanwhile say they are unable to breathe the air in the capital these days. "The air is polluted, nothing can be seen after five in the evening, people get sick," said a Kabul resident.

Kabul is one of the most polluted cities in the world. Even though billions of dollars poured into the country in the last two decades and huge sums of money was used to fight climate change, the air quality in Kabul continues to deteriorate.

Iran navy receives new cruise missiles amid growing tension

range of 1,000 km (621 miles) as well as reconnaissance helicopters, state media reported on Sunday, as the U.S. accused Iran of a drone attack on a chemical tanker in the Indian ocean.

"The Talaeiyeh cruise missile has a range of over 1,000 km and is a smart missile that can change targets mid-mission," state media cited the head of Iran's navy, Shahram Irani, as saying. Reconnaissance helicopters, drones and marine cruise missiles were among new weapons added to the navy's arsenal, Irani said, adding that "all of this equipment has designed and produced by Iran's military industry" Although Western military analysts say Iran sometimes exaggerates its capabilities. Iranian-made missiles and drones are a key element in Tehran's military hardware.
