PM okays Operation Azm-i-Istehkam

The prime minister chaired a meeting of Central Apex Committee on National Action Plan. Azm-e-Istehkam will integrate and synergize multiple lines of effort to combat the menaces of extremism and terrorism in a comprehensive and decisive manner," said in a press release issued

The meeting was attended by key ministers of the federal cabinet including the Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Mohammad Ishaq Dar, Defence Minister Khawaja Muhammad Asif, Interior Minister Syed Mohsin Naqvi, Finance Minister Muhammad Aurangzeb, Law Minister Azam Nazeer Tarar and Information Minister Attaullah Tarar. Additionally, the chief ministers of all provinces and Gilgit-Baltistan, Services Chiefs and chief secretaries of the provinces along with other senior civilian, military and Law Enforcement Agencies officers were present. The forum conducted a comprehensive review of the ongoing counter-terrorism campaign and assessed the internal security situation.

"The forum reiterated that the fight against extremism and terrorism was Pakistan's war and was absolutely essential for the nation's survival and well-being. The forum resolved that no one would be allowed to challenge the writ of the state without any exception," it was added. The rogress on the multi-domain tenets of the National Action Plan was scrutinized, with particuar emphasis on identifying shortcomings in the implementation for addressing the same on top riority. The necessity for a comprehensive and reinvigorated counter-terrorism strategy, founded on complete national consensus and system-wide synergy, was underscored.

In the politico-diplomatic domain, the forum resolved that efforts would be intensified to cur-

ail the operational space for terrorists through regional cooperation. ISLAMABAD: Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) informed the Supreme Court (SC) of Pakistan that the Sunni Ittehad Council (SIC) is not

entitled to reserved seats. In a reply submitted to the apex court in the case pertaining to the SIC's reserved seats, the ECP maintained that The Hamid Raza-led party failed to submit the list of nominees for the reserved seats by the deadline of December 24th The ECP added that it asked the independent candidates joined the SIC after the elections. "The ECP decided not to give reserved seats to the SIC with a 4-1 verdict," the reply added.

The ECP told the SC that the Peshawar High Court (PHC) also upheld its decision. The election watchdog maintained that there is no error in the decision of the ECP as well as the PHC. "According to the constitution of the SIC, a non-Muslim cannot become a member of the party. The provision against the inclusion of non-Muslims in the constitution of SIC is unconstitutional, answer. The SIC is not entitled to reserved seats for women and minorities," the ECP reply added. The SC full court headed by Chief Justice of Pakistan (CJP) Qazi Faez Isa will hear the SIC's plea on June 24.

Citing the "bellicose rhetoric" on both sides, UN chief Guterres warned Friday that the risk of all-out war was real. "One rash move — one miscalculation — could trigger a catastrophe that goes far beyond the border, and frankly, beyond imagination," he said. Israel's ally the United States has appealed for de-escalation. The violence on the Lebanon border began after the October 7 attack on southern Israel by Hamas militants from Gaza. That attack resulted in the deaths of 1,194 people, mostly civilians, according to an AFP tally based on Israeli official figures.

The militants also seized hostages, 116 of whom remain in Gaza although the army says 41 are dead. As of Thursday, Israel's retaliatory offensive had killed at least 37,431 people, also mostly civilians, according to Gaza's health ministry. Months of negotiations toward a truce and a hostage release have failed to make headway, but mediator Qatar insisted Friday it was still working to "bridge the gap" between Israel and Hamas.

The war has destroyed much of Gaza's infrastructure and left residents short of food, fuel and other essentials. On June 16 the army said it would implement a daily "tactical pause of military activity" in a southern Gaza corridor to facilitate aid delivery. Water emergency halts tourist arrivals in Italy

ROME (AP): A water emergency prompted the mayor of Capri — one of Italy's most popular islands to order a halt to the arrival of tourists on Saturday, in a crisis that has deprived some areas of any

water supply.
Without a water supply, it is impossible to guarantee essential services to "thousands of people" who travel to the island daily during the tourist season, Mayor Paolo Falco said. 'The health and hygiene situation is explosive, we have taken our countermeasures and activated the crisis unit and issued a restrictive order," the mayor's order said. The emergency was caused by a failure in the mainland's water system that provides vital supplies to the world-known island.

At the moment water is still supplied to most of the island, but some isolated areas of the upper municipality of Anacapri are already dry. Only local reservoirs supply the network, which in the absence of supplies from the mainland risks being run out. Meanwhile, tanks are expected to reach the island to support essential services, pending the restoration of full supply.

The Mayor's order was notified shortly after 0900 a.m. causing an immediate stop to ticket sales. The move has created long lines of passengers at the ticket offices at the ports of the southern city of Naples, the departing point for most ferries to Capri. Ferries and hydrofoils that had already departed for Capri were contacted by radio by the maritime authorities, which ordered their return to port and disembarkation of pas-

Attack on army base in Burkina Faso

(BBC): An MANSILA attack that reportedly killed more than 100 soldiers on an army base in Burkina Faso has snowballed into speculation about unrest in the security forces, in a country where the military has been in power since 2022. The leader of the military junta has since appeared on state TV in an attempt to debunk the rumours.

Burkina Faso has been battling Islamist insurgents trists and business leaders. for several years and about half the country is outside government control. group Jamaat Jihadist al-Islam Nusrat wal-Muslimin (JNIM) has said it was behind last Tuesday's attack in the northern town of Mansila. The following day, there was an explosion near the headquarters of the state television.

According to several armed men reports, attacked the military base, located near the border with Niger, on 11 June. Around 100 soldiers were killed and many others were missing, reports say, adding that several hundred civilians fled Mansila for neighbouring towns in search of safety. Five days after the attack, JNIM, an al-Qaeda affiliate, said it was behind the attack, and that dozens of soldiers

were killed. The group shared a video showing a large amount of weapons and ammunition that it says were captured during the assault. There are also videos of JNIM fighters riding motorbikes and shooting relentlessly in a remote village of mud-walled buildings. The BBC has not been able to verify the video. The armed forces have since blockaded Mansila and it is not possible to enter the city without a military convoy.

Junta leader Ibrahim Traoré broke his silence on the attack, 10 days after it happened. He said the military had launched an operation after the assault, and sent reinforcement troops. But he did not address JNIM's allegation that it carried out the

A day after the Mansila attack, a rocket hit the parking area of state TV Radiodiffusion Télévision Burkinabé (RTB) in the capital, Ouagadougou. On its Facebook page, described the event as a "shooting incident" that resulted in "two minor injuries, quickly taken care of by the presidential health service".

Rivals attack Farage for saying West provoked Kyiv war

LONDON (BBC): Nigel Farage has been criticised for suggesting the West "provoked" Russia's invasion of Ukraine by expanding the European Union and Nato military alliance eastwards. The Reform UK leader told the BBC that "of course" the war was President Vladimir Putin's fault.

But he added that the expansion of the EU and Nato gave him a "reason" to tell the Russian people "they're coming for us again". Former Conservative Defence Secretary Ben Wallace, who is not standing in the election, told BBC Radio 4's Today programme Mr Farage was like a "pub bore we've all met at the end of the bar". Conservative Home Secretary James Cleverly said Mr Farage was echoing Mr Putin's "vile justification" for the war and Labour branded him "unfit" for any politi-

The former UKIP leader later said he was one of "the few figures" that had been 'consistent and honest" on the issue. In an interview with the BBC's Nick Robinson, Mr Farage was challenged over his judgement and past statements, including when ne named Russian President Vladimir Putin as the world leader he most admired in 2014. "I said I disliked him as a person, but admired him as a political operator because he's managed to take control of running Russia," Mr Farage said.

He was then pressed over a social media post in February 2022, when he claimed the Russian invasion of Ukraine was "a consequence of EU and Nato expansion". Mr Farage said he had been arguing since the 1990s that "the ever eastward expansion" of the Nato military alliance and the EU was giving President Putin "a reason to [give to] his Russian people to say they're coming for us again and to go to war". He added: "We provoked this war. Of course, it's [President Putin's] fault."

Mr Wallace - who oversaw the UK's response to the Russian invasion of Ukraine in 2022 - said Mr Farage "is a bit like that pub bore we've all met at the end of the bar" and often presents "very simplistic answers" to complex problems. He also said the Reform UK leader had been "consistently wrong" on the issue, adding: "Putin isn't really invading Ukraine because of Nato expansion.

Mr Wallace noted that a 7,000-word essay penned by the Russian leader before the invasion began - that was later seen as outlining his rationale for starting the war only mentions Nato in a single paragraph. Conservative Home Secretary James Cleverly said Mr Farage was "echoing Putin's vile justification for the brutal invasion of Ukraine".

said Mr Farage's comments made him "unfit for any political office in our country, let alone leading a serious party in Parliament". Former Nato Secretary General Lord Robertson accused Mr Farage of "parroting the Kremlin Line" and "producing new excuses for the brutal, unprovoked attack". During the interview, the Reform UK leader claimed Lord Robertson had agreed the war was caused by the expansion of the EU.

Saying that we provoked Russia is like saying that if you buy a burglar alarm, in some way you provoke burglars," Lord Robertson told Radio 4's The World Tonight. After the interview aired, Mr Farage said on X (formerly Twitter) that he was "one of the few figures that have been consistent and honest about the war with Russia". Alongside the new statement, he reposted a speech in the European Parliament from 2014 in which he called for the West to "stop playing war games with Putin."

Russia launched a full-scale invasion of Ukraine in February 2022. It followed the occupation of the Crimea and Donbas regions in 2014. Ukraine is not a member of the EU or Nato, which is made up of 32 countries across Europe and North America. However, the country applied to join both blocs following the Russian inva-

Nato was formed in 1949 by 12 countries, including the US, UK, Canada and France. After the Soviet Union's collapse in 1991, many Eastern European countries joined including Hungary, Poland and Estonia. The EU has also expanded since the 1990s, with a number of eastern

European countries joining in 2004.

In the interview, Mr Farage also accused the Conservatives of failing to deliver on Brexit. As the leader of UKIP, he was a key figure in the campaign to leave the EU. While the issue dominated the 2019 general election, with Boris Johnson campaigning on the slogan "Get Brexit Done", it has not featured prominently in the current campaign. Asked if he stood by his previous claim that Brexit had failed, Mr Farage said: "No, it's not a failure but we failed to

"It can't be a failure. We've left the European Union. We're now self-governing." But he added: "Brexit has failed those who voted for it, believing that immigration numbers would be reduced." Net migration - the difference between the number of people coming to live in the UK and those leaving - has risen sharply since 2021, when the UK left the EU.

Ending growth won't save the planet

VER since Thomas Malthus argued just over 200 years ago that population growth would outstrip "the power of the earth to produce subsistence for man," there has been a continuous parade of Cassandras fretting that humanity is about to exhaust the planet's carrying capacity. Neo-Malthusian thinking inspired such 20th-century writings as Paul Ehrlich's 1968 book, "The Population Bomb," and the Club of Rome's 1972 "The Limits to Growth," which predicted civilization would end "sometime within the next one hundred years." In "Toward a Steady-State Economy," published in 1973, economist Herman Daly argued that economic growth should be resisted for the sake of the environment.

Climate change is drawing out such sentiments again. Yet the prescription — that economic growth must stop — is as wrong as it was when the grim Rev. Malthus predicted that a growing population would outstrip the Earth's capacity to produce food, requiring famine, war and pestilence to bring humanity's numbers back to a sustainable level.

"Degrowth" — the brand name for neo-Malthusianism — ignores how ingenuity and innovation have repeatedly empowered humanity to overcome ecological constraints identified by Malthus, Ehrlich, et al. Degrowthers ignore basic lessons of history: The world experienced no growth for hundreds of years. Getting ahead economically during certain periods of the Middle Ages, for example, required plundering one's neighbor. Transactions were zero-sum. The outcome was centuries of conquest and subjugation. Malthus made his predictions just as England and the rest of Europe were about to enter a two-century era of unprecedented economic growth, which liberated much of humanity from misery and drastically improved health and well-being. Ehrlich's prophecies came just as the Green Revolution in agriculture was saving hundreds of millions from hunger.

Growth built a world in which one person's gain needn't require another's loss. Consensual politics and democracy wouldn't have been possible without it. We wonder how Daly or his acolytes would be received in the bustling yet poor megalopolis of Lagos, Nigeria, proclaiming the end of growth (or procreation) to save the planet.

And yet degrowth is coming back in fashion. The ranks of degrowthers include progressive journalist Naomi Klein, Swedish activist Greta Thunberg and even Pope Francis. At least one European university is now offering a master's degree in degrowth. The truth is that degrowth wouldn't fix climate change even in the unlikely event it could be imposed. Carbon emissions from economic growth can be understood as the product of four factors: population growth, growth in economic output per person, changes in the amount of energy needed for economic production, and the change in how much carbon dioxide is released when energy is consumed.

The U.S. Energy Information Administration estimates these variables up to 2050. One inescapable conclusion: Zeroing out growth in gross domestic product would do little to reduce emissions. Even if output per person remained stuck at 2023 levels all the way to mid-century, humanity would still miss its 2050 target to reach net-zero emissions — by 26 billion tons of carbon dioxide. Halting growth in rich countries alone allowing poor countries such as Nigeria to keep growing, hopefully to one day attain the economic well-being that affluent nations enjoy today would do even less for the climate. Under this scenario, the world would miss its mid-century CO2 target by 38 billion tons.

Cutting emissions to safer levels would require epic degrowth. Getting carbon dioxide emissions below 10 billion tons per year in 2050 would demand inducing recessions that would cut world GDP per capita by about 5 percent per year — more than the loss during the 2008-2009 Great Recession. Cutting carbon emissions produced by the global economy will require massive new green energy infrastructure and new clean technologies. In other words, growth and innovation. The Energy Information Administration assumes that in a world of fast economic growth, each dollar of GDP will require some 13 percent less energy in 2050 than in a world in which growth slows.

Of course, GDP isn't a true barometer of a civilization's well-being. Proponents of untrammeled growth ignore the damage that it imposes on the environment and on human health. But that calls for mitigating the damage, not abandoning growth altogether. Degrowth's prophets offer little more than hand-waving in response to the most elementary questions about their prescription. Degrowth evangelist Kohei Saito suggests "degrowth communism," seemingly unaware that countries such as Albania and North Korea have already had that experience. Unsurprisingly, most degrowthers were born not in societies that have tried and failed to do without growth but in those that are already rich.

Could a Starmer win boost Biden's hopes?

Given the concentration of Trump's support in key swing states, the magazine gives him a two-in-three chance of victory. Neither Trump's recent conviction nor positive economic figures seem to be shifting the dial in Biden's favor.

On the other side of the Atlantic, the picture is quite different for fellow progressive Keir Starmer. The Labour leader has a seemingly unassailable lead in the polls and is likely to become the UK's next prime minister when elections are held on July 4. Not only is he forecast to win, but the latest Ipsos poll has Labour obliterating Prime Minister Rishi Sunak. If accurate, Starmer will take 453 seats in Parliament, leaving Sunak's Conservatives with 115 their worst defeat since the modern party was founded

This raises the question whether a Starmer landslide in July might offer a boost to Biden's beleaguered reelection campaign. US elections often feature "October surprises" unexpected events, often from abroad, that dramatically influence the outcome of the election. Though Starmer's victory has long been forecast, might a landslide win serve as a fillip to Biden?

Firstly, it is possible that a significant Starmer win could influence some US voters to favor Biden over While Trump. American voters pay little attention to British politics, there is some evidence to suggest Britain's decision to vote to leave the EU in 2016 had a positive impact on Trump's election later that year. Trump sought to connect his campaign to the UK's "liberation" from the EU, stating his victory would be "Brexit plus, plus,

It is plausible to think that Biden's team will be eager to learn lessons that they can import back to the US for November.

But at the same time, Starmer's Labour are ideological fellow travelers of the Democrats and will privately have a strong preference for a Biden victory.

One opportunity to indirectly aid Biden comes soon after the UK election: NATO's 75th anniversary summit in Washington from July 9. In opposition, Starmer pitched to have a high-profile meeting with Biden, without success. At the summit, in contrast, it might be the president who is keen to have his picture taken with the victorious Labour leader. Beyond the public pleasantries, Starmer could also help Biden at the summit by emphasizing the commitment NATO.

Trump, a NATO skeptic, has long claimed that the US' allies do not pay their way. Labour has already pledged to raise defense spending to 2.5 percent of gross domestic product, matching Conservative commitment. Starmer could make much of this in Washington, enabling Biden to reassure US voters that, unlike Trump, he has been able to persuade allies to increase their NATO bur-

Beyond NATO, Starmer will have other opportunities to support Biden's initiatives. Labour is committed to the war in Ukraine and has largely agreed with the Conservatives' line of backing US positions on the Middle East. Should Biden's flailing Gaza ceasefire plan gain traction in the coming weeks and months, Starmer will be well positioned to offer the White House highprofile support.

7, I began learning photography under the guidance of my friend Mahmoud Abu Salama. Mahmoud owns a Canon camera, something I've always wanted. would let me use it, which felt like receiving a precious gift.

I loved capturing moments, but being a perfectionist, I hesitated to use a camera until I felt skilled enough. I started watching online videos on how to take great photos and learned that symmetry enhances beauty. Whenever I saw something symmetrical, I felt an irresistible urge to photograph it.

Mahmoud couldn't always lend me his Canon, and I didn't have the money to buy my own, so, I decided to get a Lumix as a temporary solution until I could afford a more expensive camera. With my new Lumix, I discovered that spiral patterns attract people's attention. Just a month into my photography journey, I received an Erasmus scholarship to study for one semester in Spain as a cultural exchange student from the English literature department at my university, Al-Aqsa.

2023. There, I learned that incorporating a human element makes photos more compelling and that the best photos tell a story. In Spain, I lost my Lumix, which made me feel frustrated. I think I left it somewhere, and when I went back to search for it, it had been stolen. The camera had a lot of memories that connected me with Gaza. However, I realised that while cameras can preserve some moments, we still carry the most important memories within us. For me, those are the memories from my beloved home, Gaza.

We lived in constant fear, under bombardment, with no safe place to turn to.

The schools where I graduated and was awarded for being at the top of my class, the places where I forged the strongest friendships and laughed the most, and the places where I felt most at home – all gone. I am fortunate to have escaped Gaza. On March 3, I left after a successful fundraising campaign, thanks to the support of kind people and connections made through my work teaching Arabic and freelancing. My mother and some siblings are safe in Cairo, but my father stayed in Gaza with my other siblings. This left my heart broken apart – a piece of it is in Gaza with my father, other siblings, and friends; another is in Cairo; and yet another is with my sister in Algeria, where she is a university student on a scholarship in international law. There is also one piece of my heart that died when I left Gaza.

My mother, siblings and I now face hardship in Egypt and the pain of uncertainty: What will happen if a ceasefire is announced? Will we return to Gaza, or will we be forced to stay in Egypt? Keir Starmer's empty promise of British renewal

RECENT British prime ministers have been routinely ambushed by reality. David Cameron didn't see Brexit coming. Theresa May underestimated the appeal of Corbynism. Boris Johnson couldn't handle COVID. Liz Truss was removed from office by the financial markets. Street? The Labour leader has carefully positioned himself as a moderating force in United Kingdom politics; a stable, centrist alternative to 14 years of incumbent "Tory chaos". For this, he has been rewarded with a 20-point poll lead and the prospect of a crushing summer rout of Conservative seats. One survey, published at the start of June, even indicated that he could win the largest Westminster majority of any British politician since Stanley Baldwin in 1924. But dispatching Sunak's desperate and beleaguered right-wing government will be the easy part. Actually running Britain – a country recently characterised by The Financial Times as "poor" with "pockets of rich people" - will be much harder. Starmer doesn't look even slightly up to the task.

Prix pole BARCELONA (AFP): McLaren's Lando Norris produced a spellbinding late lap to deprive Max Verstappen of pole for the Spanish Grand Prix qualifying on day. Lewis Saturday. Hamilton will start on the second row alongside his Mercedes teammate George Russell. Verstappen looked sure to start Sunday's 10th round of the season from the front of the grid. They emphasized the importance of sharing accurate and verified data related to diseases, both for the benefit of citizens and to maintain transparency within the international community.

Four FC men martvred. four injured in Dir attack F.P. Report

LOWER DIR: Four soldiers of the Frontier Corps 185 Wing and 181 Wing embraced martyrdom while four others including a Captain were injured when militants attacked the moving troops at Lamotai Top, Suripao and Safarai forest in the upper part of Maidan here on Saturday, sources

They said that there were reports about the entry of militants from the Afghanistan side via the Shahi border area. On getting information, the FC troops led by Captain Yasin, Captain Asfandiar and Subidar Hamza were moving forward to block the militants' movement when the latter attacked the troops. As a result four solincluding Sepoy Swati, Subidar Anees Swati, Subidar Shahab, Havaldar Roshan and Sepoy Mubarik were martyred while Captain Altaf, Sepoy Muhammad Yasin, Sepoy Shakir and Naik Lal Gull were injured.

The forces retaliated and surrounded the three different locations of the militants. Later the hideouts were also shelled from helicopters. According to locals the suspected locations were also fired from the artillery. The situation prompted high ups to send regular troops of the army. According to unconfirmed reports, SSG Commandos were also sent to the area to counter the attackers. Sources said the troops had cordoned off the suspected locations and the search and strike operation was continued till the filing of this report.

Camel incident: Suspects sent to jail

NAWABSHAH (INP): A judicial magistrate on Saturday rejected the police request for further physical custody of six suspects allegedly involved in mutilating a camel's leg near Mund Jamrao in Sanghar district and sent them to jail on judicial remand.

The suspects were produced before the judge after completion of the earlier four-day remand in police custody, with police requesting an extension which judicial magistrate Habibullah Siyal rejected. According to the SSP Sanghar, two out of six suspects namely Abdul Shakoor Shar and Abid Shar have confessed to their crime in the probe.

A landlord in Sindh's Sanghar district allegedly chopped off a camel's leg as punishment for scavenging into his field for fodder. According to police, the incident occurred in Mund Jamrao village in Sanghar district on Friday. Soomer Khan, owner of the camel, narrated the incident along with his camel at Sanghar press club. "I have no enmity with anyone. I don't know why this was done to my

camel," he said. Sanghar SSP took notice of the incident after the video of camel with chopped leg went viral on social media. Police lodged an FIR on behalf of the state against unknown persons under sections 429 and 34 PPC.

Pakistan calls for action against TTP's cross-border attacks

terrorist attacks by the Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) that have resulted in hundreds of civilian and military casualties.

"The highest priority - for the international community, for Afghanistan's neighbours and for Afghanistan itself – remains the elimination of terrorism within and from Afghanistan," Ambassador Munir Akram, the permanent representative of Pakistan to the UN, said in a debate on the situation in Afghanistan. Pakistan, he said, has repeatedly conveyed to the Taliban — at very senior levels — to act decisively to end TTP's attacks, disarm its fighters, capture and hand over the terrorist group's fighters to Pakistan.
"Unfortunately, despite promises, no

meaningful action has been taken so far. TTP safe havens remain close to Pakistan's borders. Cross-border attacks have continued, including one by a TTP associate that killed several Chinese engineers working on the Dasu hydro power project," the Pakistani envoy told the 15member Council. "The impunity which some of these terrorist groups seem to enjoy within Afghanistan poses a dire and direct threat to all of Afghanistan's neighbours as well as to the international com-

Ambassador Akram, therefore, urged the Security Council to call on the Taliban government to sever its links with the TTP and its associates; prevent them from carrying out cross-border attacks against Pakistan; disarm the TTP terrorists and and capture the TTP's leadership and hand them over to Pakistan. At the outset, he said Pakistan has consistently advocated for sustained engagement with the Afghan interim authorities to normalize the situation in that country.

While welcoming the Taliban's announced decision to participate in the upcoming UN-sponsored meeting in "be clear about the overall objectives they seek". "Unless we know where we are going, we will never get there," he

"Pakistan has a national compulsion to promote peace, stability and development in Afghanistan. And we will continue to work at all levels - bilateral, regional and international and with the UN- to achieve these objectives.'

Opening the debate, Roza Otunbayeva, Special Representative of the Secretary-General and Head of the United Nations Assistance Mission in Afghanistan (UNAMA), noted that the upcoming meeting in Doha, the third one in this format, is scheduled to take place in nine days and the Taliban have stated that they are preparing to attend. "We hope that in Doha, key stakeholders will convene around the table, speak to each other face to face, reinforce the principles underlining the consensus to engage, and agree on next steps to alleviate the uncertainties that face the Afghan people". But, she warned, Doha "has generated significant expectations that cannot realistically be met in a single meeting".

While there is no substitute for engagement with Afghanistan, "it cannot be repeated enough that this sort of engagement is not legitimization or normalization", Ms Otunbayeva added.
