Six terrorists killed in attack on Bannu Cantt

BANNU: Security forces foiled a major terrorist attack on Bannu attack Cantonment in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and killed at least six attackers, security forces said on Tuesday. Sources added that suicide bombers belonging to the militant group Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) drove two explosive-laden cars into the compound's perimeter, triggering massive explosions.

Facing stiff resistance from security forces, two explosive-laden vehicles were rammed into the cantt's perimeter wall in an attempt to gain entry, added security sources.

Meanwhile, security personnel at various entry points neutralised six terrorists and apprehended others. Sources reported that the explosion caused they added.

Finance Muhammad Aurangzeb on Tuesday confirmed that dis-

cussions between International Monetary Fund (IMF) and Pakistan for the first biannual review of the \$7 billion programme had begun, adding that the country was "well-positioned" for the talks.

Pakis-tan and the IMF had reached a three-year, \$7bn aid package deal in July, with the new programme set to allow the country to "cement macroeconomic stability and create conditions for stronger, more inclusive and resilient growth". A nine-member mission from the IMF has began its first biannual review of Pakistan's \$7bn Extended Fund Facility (EFF).

"They are here. We will have two rounds of talks, first technical and then policy level," Aurangzeb confirmed. "I think we are wellpositioned [for the review]," he added.

The IMF delegation, led by Nathan Porter, will hold discussions with Pakistani authorities for 10 days from March 3 to 14, assessing the country's compliance with quantitative performance criteria, structural benchmarks and indicative targets under the 37-month programme. A senior government official involved in preparations for the IMF review said there were some technical slippages for certain given deadlines, but they had been overcome with some delays within weeks or a month. The most critical weak-

ness observed so far had been the revenue shortfall against programme targets, the official said. But he hastened to add that this had been more than compensated through a higher-than-targeted primary budget surplus and greater-than-estimated revenue-to-GDP ratio owing to better receipts from nontax revenues like central bank profit, petroleum levy, telecom profits, etc.

EFF programme consists of six reviews over the life of the bailout, and the release of the next tranche of approximately \$1bn will be contingent on the success of the performance review. Just before the IMF mission's visit, the lender reiterated last week that its programme aimed to raise Pakistan's notably low tax-to-GDP ratio by 3pc of GDP while improving the fairness and efficiency of the tax system by broadening the tax base and improving tax compliance.

Three key areas of focus include: expanding direct taxes by bringing retailers, property owners and agricultural income into the tax net; rationalising personal and corporate income taxes by reducing exemptions and streamlining rates in the general sales tax system; and enhancing Federal Excise Duty coverage and eliminating tariff exemptions to increase customs revenue.

KARACHI (PPI): Jamaat-e-Islami Sindh chief Kashif Saeed Sheikh today expressed discontent with the ruling government's performance over the past one year, citing issues such as insecurity, terrorism, inflation, and economic decline as

According to JI, Mr Sheikh highlighted the disparity between government claims of a nine-year low inflation rate and the rising prices of essential items like poultry, oil. meat, sugar, and fruits.

He questioned which have actually become cheaper, pointing out that while the elite remain unaffected by price increases, ordinary citizens are struggling to make ends meet as expenses rise without a corresponding increase in income.

Sheikh urged the government to create employment opportunities and provide subsidies on essential goods to offer relief to the masses, rather than making them dependent on Benazir Income Support Program. He emphasized that without reducing fuel, gas, and electricity prices, controlling inflation is not feasi-

He also called for a reduction in the number of ministers and advisors. advocating for a smaller cabinet and policies of simplicity and austerity, instead of laying off lower-level employees. Sheikh acknowledged that inflation is a global issue but insisted that the government should address what is within its control.

Traders raise security concerns F.P. Report

WANA: The absence of police force, apart from traffic police officers, in Rustam Bazaar, Wana, South Waziristan Lower, has raised serious security concerns among the local population. Kim accuses Trump admn of stepping up provocations

SEOUL (Reuters): North Korea's Kim Yo Jong, the powerful sister of leader Kim Jong Un, criticised the Trump administration for stepping up "provocations" and said it justified the nuclear state increasing its nuclear deterrent, state media KCNA said. Kim denounced the US aircraft carrier USS Carl Vinson's visit to South Korea, saying the action was part of a "policy of confrontation" against North Korea.

"As soon as its new administration appeared this year, the US has stepped up the political and military provocations against the DPRK, 'carrying forward' the former administration's hostile policy," Kim said, according to Tuesday's KCNA report. DPRK is short for Korea's official the Democratic People's Republic of Korea. "Hostile policy toward the DPRK pursued by the US at present is offering sufficient justification for the DPRK to indefinitely bolster ... its nuclear war deterrent," Kim added. South Korea's defence

ministry said in a statement on Tuesday that Kim Yo Jong's comments were nothing more than deception to justify its nuclear development. missile 'North Korea's nuclear weapons are never acceptable, and the only way for North Korea to survive is to abandon its obsession and delusion about nuclear (weapons)," the ministry said in a statement. As Arab states work in Cairo to end one conflict, Israel tries to start another

THE three-phase ceasefire deal between Israel and Hamas is in critical condition with the collapse of phase one over the weekend, though it is not moribund. Neither side has repudiated the plan, and a summit of the Arab League taking place in Cairo on Tuesday aims to breathe new life into conversations about "the day after" the war ends. If it can paint an enticing enough picture of what that looks like, the hope is both sides and their chief interlocutor America will push harder to manifest "the day before".

And yet, Israel's Ministry of Defence is already spoiling for a new fight, this time in Syria. The pretext for a possible Israeli intervention there was laid out by the ministry on Sunday after weekend clashes between Syria's new rulers, mainly derived from the militant group HTS, and militias from the country's Druze community in Jaramana, a Damascus suburb. "If the [Syrian] regime harms the Druze," the Israeli statement said, "it will be harmed by

Community tensions in Syria were perhaps inevitable, given HTS's sudden sweep to power and the infancy of the country's reconciliation process after more than a decade of civil war. An Israeli intervention, however, is not. Nor would it be helpful – no Druze leaders have called for Israeli support, and some have even warned it is part of a "plot" to divide Syria.

The suspicion is warranted. Last month, Israeli Foreign Minister Gideon Saar accused Turkey of using its influence with Syria's new rulers to create a new front against Israel. Last week, reports emerged of a meeting between US and Israeli officials in which the latter urged Washington to allow Russia to keep its Syrian military

There is no shortage of commitment to peace on the Arab side. All four of Israel's Arab neighbours – Egypt, Jordan, Lebanon and even Syria under HTS - have repeatedly said they want stable relations with it on the basis of a mutual respect for sovereignty. Israel must start to behave as though it feels the same and extend that


principle to Palestinians. As must Washington. Global attention was focused over the weekend on Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy being chastised in the White House on Friday for seeking security guarantees in advance of talks with Russia to end his country's war. This new American foreign policy doctrine of "peace first, guarantees later" does not seem to apply to Israel, which appears free to carry on fighting with American financial backing as its diplomats resist talks for phase two of the ceasefire or wider peace talks and instead are speaking of opening a new front.

In this context, the Cairo summit is even more important. All countries in the region, and the US, should be focused on ending conflicts rather than creating new ones. Grand, hopeful visions are needed, if only to give negotiators some direction. Arab states are already united in their support for Palestine and ending the Gaza war through the Arab Peace Initiative, which involves a sovereign Palestinian state in exchange for establishing ties with Israel.

The task ahead for the summit's attendees is to show how this plan remains relevant despite the many developments that have taken place since its inception in 2002, with new details including Gaza reconstruction and Palestinian post-war governance. Washington must understand that the ideal solution is the most obvious one: not Israeli expansionism or Palestinian militancy, but Palestinians and Israelis living side by side, in peace, with two states.

Few films from a purely Palestinian perspective have been given a platform. Two films from Nazareth-born Palestinian director Hany Abu-Assad – Paradise Now (2006) and Omar (2014) have received Oscar nominations. The former, to note, had an Israeli producer. And short films from Palestinian directors including Basil Khalil's Ave Maria (2016) and Farah Nabulsi's The Present (2021) without Israeli top-line credits have received nominations. The British-Palestinian Nabulsi has since been invited to be an Academy member.

siege in our neighbourhood, Sheikh Radwan, in December 2023, we used to throw water bottles through the windows to our neighbour and his daughter to make sure they had something to drink.

We also provided food to other people in need by throwing it over the wall separating our home from other homes.

During our second displacement, a friend of my father's opened his home for us in the south, and we remained there for four months.

The men of our neighbourhood made a schedule to help each other in making shelters in damaged houses. They helped us put up tarps and secure them with poles to the ground and mend walls in our damaged home. We helped others by providing electricity to power the equipment through our barely functioning solar panel.

"Home" is now what most people in Gaza long for. It is supposed to be a warm place of sweet memories you can escape when the world becomes too much to bear. It is not supposed to be a tent, a school or a destroyed house.

But Palestinians have been here before. Threequarters of the population of Gaza are refugees or descendants of refugees who lost their homes in the Nakba. My own ancestors were expelled from their homes in the town of al-Majdal.

What Netanyahu and other Israeli leaders like him seem not to understand is that Gaza is not just a place for us, it is our home.

However many times Israel cuts off aid and attacks, destroying homes and displacing people, we will rebuild, not by magic, but by our own solidarity, resilience and

He also criticized US policy and said that America is "blocking" the path to peace. When he mentioned US foreign policy toward the Middle East, he received a loud round of applause. Meanwhile, Guy Pearce, who was nominated for the best supporting actor Oscar, was wearing a "Free Palestine" pin. This Hollywood scene totally contrasts with the 50th edition of the Oscars in 1978, when British actress Vanessa Redgrave won the Oscar for best supporting actress for her role in the movie "Julia." The movie was about a woman who helped Jews escape Nazi Germany. I remember attending a 2008 book signing in Dubai by John Mearsheimer and Stephen Walt for "The Israel Lobby and US Foreign Policy." book was a revelation not only because it unveiled the Israeli manipulation of the American political system and the country's policy toward the

Middle East, but because it came from two mainstream American authors and not from fringe voices. While signing my book, Mearsheimer told me it was a war of ideas. Now, after watching the Oscars and comparing the reactions to Redgrave's and Adra's acceptance speeches, I realize that Israel is losing the war of ideas that Mearsheimer deemed so important. Israel's strength comes from the support it has, mainly from the US but also from the Western world. The West's guilt over the Holocaust created a sense of duty that it needed to support Israel and secure its survival. If this support is now gone, it will be very difficult for Israel to continue on the path it is taking today. Unfortunately, Israel does not see this. It fails to realize that the world is changing. Israel is no longer seen as the weak underdog that needs protection from belligerent Arab neighbors. On the contrary, it is seen as the aggressor. However, Israel has been emboldened by the occupant of the White House. For now, Israel still has the material support of the US. While the Trump administration has cut medical and other grants to the American people, aid to Israel has increased. However, this is not sustainable. The series will begin with three matches scheduled to take place in Lahore on March 6, 8, and 11. The final match will be held in Islamabad on March 13. Due to the holy month of Ramadan, all matches will be played under floodlights. The arrival of the German junior team and the commencement of this highlight Pakistan's efforts to restore its place on the global hockey stage.

Liverpool don't fear PSG

PARIS (Agencies): Arne Slot says Liverpool have nothing to fear at the Parc des Princes as he prepares his Premier League title favourites for a block-Champions League clash against runaway Ligue 1 leaders Paris Saint-Germain. Slot's side take the next step in their bid for a first Champions League crown since 2019 when they face PSG in the last-16 first leg on Wednesday. The sixtime European champions lost on both their previous visits to PSG, in 1997 and 2018. But Liverpool have been beaten just four times in all competitions this season and only once in

the Champions League against Eindhoven in their final league-phase game, when they had already qualified for the last 16. The Reds finished first in the league phase with seven wins from eight games, including a 2-0 success against holders Real Madrid, and have een equally dominant on the domestic stage. Inspired by the sublime form of Egypt forward Mohamed Salah, Slot's men are 13 points clear at the top of the Premier League as they close in on a record-equalling 20th English title. Liverpool can also win the first trophy of the Slot era when they face Newcastle in the League Cup final at Wembley on March 16. With 20 victories, the Reds have won more league games than any team in Europe's top five leagues so far this season. After a recent wobble, Liverpool got back on track with a pair of 2-0 wins against Manchester City and Newcastle that took them a giant step closer to Premier League glory. They also benefited from a weekend off to rest before the PSG tie due to their early exit from the FA Cup. No wonder Slot made it clear Liverpool have no reason to feel any trepidation about their trip to Paris. "Do we fear PSG? We don't fear anybody. But I'm impressed by their quality, they are on an upwards curve a bit similar to ours at the moment," he said. "I don't think the likes of Liverpool, Arsenal, Paris Saint-Germain, Barcelona, Real Madrid fear opponents. "But we definitely respect them and there's a reason for that. They won so many games in a row and they have so many quality players." - 'It could have been the final' - Like Liverpool, PSG are marching relentlessly towards the French title, opening up a 13point lead thanks to a 24-game unbeaten run in Ligue 1 this season. Zealand and Bangladesh -had to travel to Dubai to play India, who promptly won all three matches. India faced Australia in

the other semi-final in Dubai on Tuesday. Critics have condemned the tournament's unusual arrangement as giving India an unfair advantage. South Africa also travelled to Dubai not knowing who they would face in the semi-finals, but instead returned to Pakistan less than 24 hours later without playing a game. Santner said scheduling in interna-tional cricket "is an issue just all around".

"I think when you do have time to rest and recover it's very important," said the skipper, whose side beat hosts Pakistan and then Bangladesh in the group phase. New Zealand were well beaten by India by 44 runs but had already reached the semi-finals by then.

"One-day cricket can be very exhausting on the body, so for us it's making sure that the bowlers are ready," Santner said.

LAHORE (AFP): Captain Temba Bavuma said South Africa will not change their approach for Wednesday's Champions Trophy semi-final against New Zealand despite the team's poor record in knock-out matches.

KABUL (TOLOnews): Some Afghan migrants with US immigration cases once again say they are facing an uncertain fate. They add that they are struggling with various financial challenges, as well as the risk of deportation and detention by Pakistani authorities and urgently

"In 2021, we received an email from the US State Department instructing us to reach a third country. Now, we have been living in Pakistan for three and a half years," said one Afghan migrant with a US immigration case in Pakistan.

"We urge the United States to resume the relocation process for migrants. So far, no concrete action has been taken in this regard," said Another individual with a US immigration case. Meanwhile, some migrant rights activists stress that

the United States must fulfill its commitments to Afghan migrants. "The United States must urgently restart the process of relocating and resettling these migrants," said Ali Reza Karimi, a migrant rights activist.

The doctor cautioned anemia could be life-threatening and advised girls and women showing symptoms physicians consult immediately.

She asked young girls to eat a balanced diet with vitamin C-rich foods, leafy vegetables and calcium-rich items like milk and eggs. Pregnant women should

receive regular medical care and take iron supplements, especially during the first three months of pregnancy
