

It is this superior will and unshakeable determination that makes us distinct from India, and this distinction will remain until the end of time.

Indian leaders and military commanders are well aware of this reality. They know that if Pakistan is pushed to the wall, it will not stay silent. The international community too has seen this unwavering spirit. There have been moments in history when Indian actions forced a strong response from Pakistan. One such occasion was when India resorted to its usual mischief, prompting the then Prime Minister of Pakistan, Chaudhry Shujaat Hussain, to warn India bluntly; "We did not make our missiles to launch on Shab-e-Barat." This bold and direct statement clearly communicated Pakistan's preparedness and seriousness in the face of Indian provocations.

A historic moment unfolded during President General Muhammad Zia-ul-Haq's visit to India. Amid high tensions, he attended a cricket match between Pakistan and India in an Indian stadium. Nuclear weapons are not trophies-they are serious tools of national defense, and their presence is a reminder to the world that any recklessness in South Asia could have devastating global consequences. Therefore, it is the responsibility of the international community, especially the global superpowers, to counsel India not to play with fire. Any hostile adventure against Pakistan will not only endanger regional peace but could also trigger uncontrollable escalation.

Despite the passing of decades and many opportunities for escalation. Pakistan has always opted for restraint, dialogue, and peace. Even today, our desire remains to coexist peacefully with all our neighbors, including India. But this desire should never be misread as timidity. Our history, our capability, and our willpower all reflect a nation that seeks peace but stands fully prepared for any sacrifice to defend its land.

In conclusion, Pakistan's message is clear and consistent; we want peace, stability, and mutual respect in the region. However, if our goodwill is mistaken for weakness, our response will be decisive. India must abandon its policy of provocation and pursue the principle of good neighborliness. The path forward is simple-live and let live. Peace is not only in Pakistan's interest but in the interest of the entire world. Let it not be forgotten; in a war forced upon us, every Pakistani becomes a soldier, and every inch of our land becomes a line of defense.

He stressed that drones offer a safer, environmentally friendly alternative, capable of protecting both the crop and human health.

Dr. Asif Tanveer informed that currently, farmers spend about Rs. 1000 per acre for manual spraying, using about 120 liters of water. Drone spraying reduces the water requirement to just 10 liters per acre, a 90 percent saving, while lowering the spray cost to around Rs. 800 per acre compared to Rs. 1500 by tractor sprayers. Drones can spray during the day or night and complete one acre of spraying in just 5–10 minutes, compared to 4–5 hours manually. He further explained that

when spreading fertilizer manually, one person needs a full day to cover eight acres, but with a drone, the same task can be completed in an hour, and the liquid fertilizer is distributed more evenly. The operational cost of using liquid fertilizer is also lower than that of solid fertilizer, helping farmers maximize economic benefits at minimal cost. Higher

Dr. Tanveer revealed that the absorption rate of traditional dry nitrogen fertilizer is only about 30 percent, while nano urea, which can be sprayed through drones, is absorbed up to 86 percent by crops. "Drone spraying has reduced the use of fertilizers and pesticides by 25 to 50 percent, saving up to 40 percent of total input costs while boosting yield by 10 to 30 percent," he

Trump administration seeks to curtail costs

THE White House wants to defund a bipartisan board that advises the president and Congress on Social Security policy, two sources familiar with the matter told Reuters, as the Trump administration moves to cut costs and eliminate independent voices in government. The White House's Office of Management and Budget has notified staff at the Social Security Advisory Board that it plans to cut the board's annual budget from around \$3 million to zero, according to the sources, who spoke on condition of anonymity to discuss non-public budgetary details.

The move to defund the SSAB has not been previously reported.

Congress established it in the 1990s as an independent federal agency to provide objective analysis on how to improve Social Security, the popular programme that annually pays out \$1.4 trillion in benefits to 73 million Americans.

While the board does not have decisionmaking power, its research has helped shape how the SSA runs itself and facilitated legis-

It has also played a role in important policy debates, including a 2005 effort under then-President George W. Bush to privatise the agency that ultimately failed.

The board's research was a key building block in a 2018 law that reduced the compliance burden for select categories of people appointed to receive benefits on behalf of those who cannot manage their own payments, while tightening checks for others.

While technically a separate agency, the advisory board's funding is a line item in the SSA's budget each year.

This month, OMB gave SSA its proposed budget for the next fiscal year from October 1, with funding for the board set at zero, the two sources said.

President Donald Trump and his Republican allies have been trying to down size the government while removing or restricting voices that could serve as a check on his agenda.

His targets have included the 17 inspectors general fired in January whose job was to root out waste and fraud. Bob Joondeph, the board's chair, told Reuters he had yet to be formally notified of the funding decision.

"Its strength is its bipartisanship. It's one of the few places you can go in government and get something that a bunch of people from different parties can reach consensus on," Joondeph, one of two Democrats on the four-person board, said in an interview.

"The fact that it would be eliminated, to me is symbolic of sort of the larger trends in Washington."

Tech billionaire Elon Musk's Department of Government Efficiency has targeted the Social Security Administration for significant cuts, triggering complaints from union officials, Democratic lawmakers and advocacy groups about longer wait times for phone service and at understaffed field offices. The agency has announced plans to eliminate 7,000 jobs, roughly 12% of its workforce.

"The Social Security Advisory Board was created to help the president and Congress strengthen the programme - but now, Trump is defunding it," Senator Elizabeth Warren said in a statement to Reuters. The SSA and the OMB did not respond to requests for comment. Neither did the two Republicanappointed members of the board. Joondeph has asked the board's staff to contact OMB for an explanation of its authority to cut funding, one of the sources said.

The bulk of the board's budget goes to paying staff. Defunding it will bring its work to a halt, but officially ending the board will require an act of Congress. Henry Aaron, a senior fellow at the Brookings Institution and a former SSAB chair, said that while the board has produced useful research over the years, its impact has been limited by the need to form a consensus between Republican and Democratic members.

Hal Daub, a former Republican congressman who was board chair from 2002 to 2006, said he believes the board has played an important role providing independent analysis, but he is sceptical it will be missed.

I often hear people say that what we are suffering cannot compare to what is happening in Gaza.

saw in my little boy's eyes was pure terror. He does not recall the whole war. He is only six years old and is still discovering the world, which on that day in early April, showed its ugly face to him.

He put his hands on the sides of my face, his little fingers trembling. He then whispered a difficult question: "Is this an earthquake?"

While everyone at home was busy trying to figure out where the bomb had fallen. I was searching in my mind for an answer to my child's question.

I smiled to try to calm him down, still thinking of an answer. Should I lie and tell him yes? Or should I explain the reality of war, the fighter jet and the missile? Should I tell him the truth: that the world has abandoned us to a fate of constant, deadly bombard-

I told him it wasn't an earthquake, that it was an airplane that had passed by and launched a missile. I decided not to share with him the gruesome details of what a missile does once it lands in civilian neighbourhoods. I did not want to distort for him his love for air-

Flying above the clouds has been Tamim's dream, and he has been saving his meagre pocket money to realise it one day.

Mentioning the airplane eased his fear and got him thinking about his flying machines. What truly worries me is that one day my son will come to realise what hearing the sound of a plane really means in Yemen.

We soon found out what the target of the air strike was: a building next to which was a house I had visited before. It was the home of the sister of a close friend of mine. I was overcome by an anxious premonition and decided to call my friend who was living in a different city.

I couldn't bring myself to tell her at the start of our conversation what had happened.

She sounded so happy on the phone. But she voice that something was

account the civilian workers employed there.

Most of them returned to their families as charred bodies. Some did not return at all - like 26-year-old Abdel Fattah. His body could not be found. His colleagues who survived said he was at the location where one of the missiles fell. When they searched for him, there was no trace no phone, no shoes, no hair, not even a piece of skin. Abdel Fattah was pulverised.

This is the worst nightmare for a family: having no body of a lost loved one to embrace and mourn.

More days passed. More air strikes hit Hodeidah. I cannot describe how heavy the moments are after a bombardment ends. Who will be the next victim? Where is death lurking? People go into a frenzy calling loved ones. A simple decision to switch off one's phone can send a family into panic.

And yet, amid all the death and destruction, Yemenis still find a way to kindness show resilience. I often hear people say that what we are suffering cannot compare to what is happening in Gaza. My fellow Yemenis see pain as a matter of comparison, not a matter of justice - as if the pain must compete against another to be recognised.

I often ask myself: Do we suffer from collective depression? Or do we possess a supernatural power that allows us to adapt to this abhorrent resignation?

Whether the air strikes increase or they stop, there is nothing that can calm our hearts down. This grief accumulates in our bodies and makes us dread what is to come.

Yemenis no longer pay attention to the rest of the world, which has reduced us to mere numbers in international agency reports and news broadcasts.

There is nothing else we can do than write. Perhaps writing can keep alive the memory of Mohamed, Abdel Fattah and hundreds of thousands of other Yemenis. Perhaps one day, understood from my shaky our writing can help stop the missiles.

Passover festival, during which Jewish people celebrate freedom and liberation, a few dozen members of the UK's Board of Deputies, the largest organization representing British Jews, took the liberty, in the best possible sense of the phrase, to express their dissent by stating that they can no longer "turn a blind eye or remain silent" about the

The 36 signatories to the rather forthright letter, published in the Financial Times newspaper, were not naive enough to believe that their public criticism of Israel for breaking the ceasefire last month would not be greeted with criticism, or even hostility, from their organization's leadership and many others among its more than 300 deputies, as well as the

broader Jewish community. Nevertheless, their brave letter, which I believe some of them would admit was long overdue, should do a world of good in promoting frank and honest future discussions within the community, and equally, if not more importantly, between Jewish diasporas and Israel.

The swift response to the letter by the Board of Deputies, which complained that "airing our grievances in public undermines the strength of our community," was somewhere between bizarre and tyrannical, especially for an organization that claims to be a broad tent and a democratic one. It was even reported that the signatories to the letter were facing disciplinary action.

This represents an outdated approach that argues all disagreements should be conducted within the community, for the sake of avoiding any washing of dirty laundry in public. It also suggests that all representatives of Jewish communities are obliged to always support Israeli policies, at least in public, even if they go against what they believe is right for Israel and for their own communities.

Frankly speaking, the letter, as important as it was, was hardly a rabid attack on Prime Minister Netanyahu's Benjamin government. It was a measured and matter-of-fact critique of a government that has violated a ceasefire agreement and once again unleashed its military might, with little or no differentiation between Hamas militants and civilians.

There are hundreds of thousands of Israelis, if not more, who would have added their signatures to this letter given the opportunity. For the signatories to declare that "the inclination to avert our eyes is strong, as what is happening is unbearable, but our Jewish values compel us to stand up and to speak out," was a show of courage in the face of the unabated killings and devastation that is being unleashed for the sake of Netanyahu's ulterior motives, not for the good of the country and its

Zverev, Sabalenka battle through in Madrid Open, Rublev defence over

MADRID (AFP): World number two Alexander Zverev was taken to the limit by Alejandro Davidovich Fokina in a gripping Madrid Open third round battle on Sunday, progressing 2-6, 7-6 (7/3), 7-6 (7/0).

The Spaniard, roared on the partisan home crowd, broke in the first and third games to claim the first set with ease.

Zverev fought to get back on serve after falling a break behind at the start of the third, and saved two break points in the ninth game which would have left Davidovich Fokina serving for the match. The German won the tie break and was stronger in the third set, breaking for a 5-4 lead.

However serving for the match, Zverev was broken to love by the in-form Davidovich Fokina, ranked 29th, but it was his last hurrah as the top seed dominated the second tie-break.

"It was a very tough win... Alex was playing unbelievable tennis, the best tennis of his life and I am happy I am through."

KABUL (Pajhwok): About 306,765 metric tonnes of goods were transported through railways from four Afghan ports last month, the Ministry of Public Works said on Sunday.
