Quetta records first death from Congo virus F.P. Report

QUETTA: Quetta recorded its first death from Congo virus this year, as an 18-year-old patient succumbed to the disease. The young man, a resident of Pishin, passed away at Fatima Jinnah General and Chest Hospital in Quetta.

He was admitted to the hospital on March 29 in critical condition and placed in the isolation ward after Congo virus was confirmed in his diagnosis. This marks the first Congo virus-related death in Quetta in 2025. It is pertinent to mention here that the National Institute of Health (NIH) issued advisories for the prevention and control of CCHF.

KP CM takes Net Hydel Profit issue with PM

In a letter addressed to the Prime Minister, the Chief Minister highlighted the constitutional provisions regarding the NHP, referring to Article 161(2) of the Constitution, which mandates that revenues generated from hydropower plants should be allocated to the entitled provinces.

In 2016, the federal government introduced an interim arrangement, later ratified by the CCI, which set the net hydropower profit rate at Rs. 1.10 per kilowatt-hour, with an annual 5% indexation.

Under this framework, payments were made to Punjab and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, but inconsistencies in these payments have led to accumulated dues of Rs. 75 billion for Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. The letter further states that in 2018, the provincial government pressed for full implementation of the KCM formula, prompting the formation of a committee under the Deputy Chairman of the Planning Commission.

In December 2019, the committee verified that Khyber Pakhtunkhwa was owed Rs. 128 billion in net hydropower profits will take place.

Deadline for Afghan refugees expires F.P. Report

ISLAMABAD: The deadline for Afghan refugees staying in Pakistan expired on March 31 and the process of the repatriation of Afghan Citizen Card (ACC) holders and illegal refugees begin from April 1.

Food and healthcare arrangements have been made for Afghans returning to home. The authorities warned of strict punitive action against those staying in the country after the deadline. Pakistan's Ministry of Interior had asked Afghan Citizen Card (ACC) holders, staying in Pakistan, to leave the country by March 31.

The Afghan nationals will be deported from April 1st (today), the ministry said in an earlier statement. "Illegal Foreigners Repatriation Program (IFRP) is being implemented since November 1, 2023. In continuation of the government's decision to repatriate all illegal foreigners, national leadership has now decided to also repatriate ACC holders, the interior ministry said in an earlier official handout.

"All illegal foreigners and ACC holders are advised to leave the country voluntarily before March 31, 2025 thereafter, deportation will commence from April 1 2025," the statement added The interior ministry said that sufficient time had already been granted for their dignified return. "It is emphasised that no one will be maltreated during the repatriation process and arrangements for food and healthcare for returning foreigners have also been put in

Mandalay was the 'city of gold' - now it reeks of death

Myanmar's former royal capital now reeks of dead bodies. So many corpses have piled up since a 7.7 "cremated in stacks", one resident

The death toll from the quake and a series of aftershocks has climbed past 2,700, with 4,521 injured and hundreds still missing, Myanmar's military chief said. Those figures are expected to rise. Residents in the country's second most populous city say they have spent sleepless nights wandering the streets in despair as Mandalay resident who spoke of bodies being "cremated in stacks" lost her aunt in the quake.

Kenyan police in Haiti suffer more casualties

NAIROBI (Reuters): Two Kenyan police officers in Haiti have been seriously injured in clashes with gangs over the past week, three officers told Reuters, adding to the mission's growing list of casualties as it comes under increasingly frequent

Kenya first deployed officers last June to the Multinational Security Support (MSS) mission, which currently has around 1,000 security personnel, about three-quarters of them from Kenya. The mission, aimed at restoring enough security for Haiti to hold elections by February 2026, has faced morale issues almost from the start and uncertainty about its possible expansion amid escalating

It suffered its first fatality in February, and the MSS reported another Kenyan officer missing last week. The three officers, who asked not to be named for fear of reprisal, said he was believed to be dead. They said the two injuries came during routine patrols in and around the capital Port-au-Prince, which is mostly controlled by heavily armed gangs blamed for thousands

of deaths since 2021. MSS spokesperson Jack Ombaka confirmed two officers had been evacuated to the Dominican Republic for medical care. "As in any mission, casualties are sometimes unavoidable," he said The three officers said the gangs were attacking them on an increasingly regular basis and complained that their equipment was inade-

quate. They said one of the officers was shot in the head after a bullet pierced his helmet and the other was hit in the ear when a gunshot penetrated the walls of an armoured vehicle. Twenty armoured vehicles have been grounded since this weekend after officers refused to use them, complaining that this was the second time a vehicle had failed to stop a bullet,

the three officers said. An MSS delegation plans to travel to Washington this week to present concerns over the quality of protective gear to US officials, two senior MSS officers told Reuters. The United States has provided most of the funding and equipment for the mission, which has struggled to secure significant contributions from other countries.

Kenya's government has cited humanitarian reasons for its intervention in Haiti, though analysts say the deployment is also motivated by a desire to boost the country's international profile and win favour with the United States. Asked about concerns about the equipment, Ombaka said: "MSS receive continues to increased logistical support from partners and stakeholders, with assurances that all equipment meets international standards." The Bangkok construction collapse is not the first time CREC and its subsidiaries have come under fire after deadly incidents. A tide of anger was unleashed at authorities in Serbia following the deaths of 14 people when a roof collapsed in November last year at a train station built by CREC subsidiaries -- largely focused on Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra, reports of alleged shortcuts made with building projects.

Evacuations ordered afters winds in California blaze

BISHOP, Calif. (AP): Firefighters stopped the forward spread of a wildfire tearing through a remote area of eastern California, but evacuation orders for residents of hundreds of homes remained in place, officials said.

The Silver Fire erupted along Route 6 in Inyo County, about miles (8 kilometers) northeast of Bishop in the Owens Valley, near the Nevada border. The cause was under investigation. It had churned through nearly 2.5 square miles (about 6.5 square kilometers) of grass and orush, the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection said in a post on the social platform X. It was 7% contained.

Residents of about 800 homes near the tiny communities of Laws, Chalfant and White Mountain Estates had been ordered evacuated after the fire broke out. Officials didn't provide an update on how many people were still under those orders. Crews were expected to stay overnight to keep an eye on hotspots and work on containment.

The potential for 65 mph (104 sph) gusts had limited flights by water-dropping helicopters and kept air tankers grounded, Cal Fire pokesperson Chloe Castillo said. The winds are very erratic," she said. final US soldier who went missing in Lithuania has been found dead, bringing to an end a massive weeklong search for the four service members whose armored vehicle was pulled from a swampy training area, the US military said.

The bodies of the three other soldiers were recovered after US, Polish and Lithuanian armed forces and authorities dug the M88 Hercules vehicle out of a peat bog at the expan-Gen. Silvestras sive ukauskas training ground in the town of Pabrade. The Army released the identities of the three soldiers recovered, but the fourth soldier's name has not been made public as family notifications continue. They were Sgt. Jose Duenez Jr., 25, of Joliet, Illinois; Sgt. Edvin F. Franco, 25, of Glendale, California; and Pfc. Dante D. Taitano, 21,

The soldiers, part of the 1st Armored Brigade Combat Team, 3rd Infantry Division, were on a tactical training exercise when they and their vehicle were reported missing a week ago, the Army said. "This past week has been devastating. Today our hearts bear the weight of an unbearable pain with the loss of our final Dogface Maj. US trade war could hit Chinese suppliers harder

RDERS have evaporated for Richard Chen, who manufactures Christmas decorations in southern China for US retailers, including Walmart

and Costco, facing crippling US tariffs.

"The orders are half of what they were last year," said Chen, who is based in the manufacturing hub of Dongguan.

He is now in survival mode.

"There's no more scope to cut prices. But to get orders we sometimes have to take a price cut ... we have no choice," Chen said, declining to elaborate on cuts he had agreed to.

"We're losing money."
On February 4, US President Donald
Trump applied a new 10% tariff to the \$400
billion worth of Chinese goods exported annually to the United States, with an additional 10% tariff announced on March 4 and further reciprocal tariffs expected on April 2.

Chinese suppliers and their American clients are now coming to grips with the grim reality that this trade war will hit harder than in Trump's first term in 2018, according to

This time is different because low-end manufacturers are already struggling with razorthin margins, so they cannot cut prices to help their US customers, and local Chinese governments that might have provided support to protect jobs are mostly too cash-strapped to give new subsidies.

Suppliers estimate wages have grown by 2-5% since the first US-China trade war of 2018, while raw material costs have climbed for some sectors and overseas competition has intensified, making Trump's latest tariffs the final straw for many low-end manufactur-

Liz Picarazzi, the Brooklyn-based founder and CEO of trash box company Citibin, said her goods produced in China are now subject to 52.5% tariffs and she can no longer afford to manufacture there.

US customers are pressing for 10% price cuts, according to interviews with 10 Chinese tion of Pakistan, Bhutto takes 44 years for Bhutto to Justice Qazi Faez Isa, much-needed manufacturers and exporters and two USbased retail executives with Chinese supply

Ongoing negotiations are yielding average discounts of 3%-7% from suppliers, they said.

On the Chinese side, suppliers who got burnt in 2018 when some US customers refused to pay for container-loads of goods subjected to higher tariffs are now asking for payments upfront rather than waiting 30-90 days after sending an invoice.

The tariffs have rattled China's industrial heartland and could lead to substantial layoffs as factories shutter or downsize, analysts and manufacturers say.

He-Ling Shi, an economics professor at Monash University in Melbourne, said Chinese manufacturers are succumbing to a wide range of pressures.

Some US customers believe Chinese authorities will step in to support their local manufacturing industries with additional tax rebates, rent and utilities subsidies or other support as they have done in the past – including in 2018...

Several suppliers interviewed by Reuters said, so far, new support had not been forth-

Economics professor Shi said the heavy debt loads of local governments, many weighed down by an ongoing property crisis. will prevent them from being as generous with subsidies as they have been in the past.

The message from Beijing is that exporters can pivot to other markets and China's own 1.4 billion customers, but that too is a difficult strategy in a time of overcapacity and depressed domestic demand.

While one of the stated aims of Trump's tariff regime is to draw manufacturing back to the US, Citibin's Picarazzi says she has looked into the possibility at least half a dozen times and it remains unfeasible from a cost and quality perspective.

For now, as she prepares to move 100% of her manufacturing to Vietnam, she says she has already advised her customers to expect higher prices.

"This is just a really unfair thing for the American government to do to American companies and American consumers," she said. "There is no patriotism in ruining American companies.

There, the teams discovered the mangled remains of ambulances and UN and Civil Defence vehicles as well as a single that Muhammad's colleague, Anwar Alatar.

On March 30, the first day of Eid al-Fitr, they went back and uncovered 14 more bodies buried in the sand in a mass grave. All of them were still dressed in their uniforms and wearing gloves. them Among were Mohammad and his colleagues Mustafa Khafaja, Ezzedine Sha'at, Saleh Moammar, Radwan, Ashraf Abu Labda, Mohammad al-Hila, and Raed al-Sharif.

The history of Rohingya militancy, rooted in decades of oppression, suggests that such desperation could fuel a violent resurgence, with transnational actors like Pakistan's Lashkar-e-Taiba potentially stepping in to capitalize on the

Other Japanese American activists and civil rights groups say much the same thing. As Kyoko Nancy Oda, who was born in a prison camp in 1945, told reporters: "We will not stand by and watch while other communities are attacked like we were. We will remind America of what can happen when our Constitution is tossed aside." That fight will likely be hard. But their moral clarity, historical perspective and empathy might be exactly what's needed in these deeply cynical and callous political times. Polls show that more Americans approve than disapprove of Trump's handling of immigration and border security. A recent Washington Post analysis of polls conducted

between February and March found that 51% of Americans supported the Trump administration figuring out a way to deport all 11 million people estimated to be living in the U.S. illegally. Meanwhile, the administration's agenda has become increasingly draconian, with ICE agents rounding up not only undocumented immigrants, but also immigrants who are in the U.S. legally, including those with green cards and visas. Even tourists. Invoking the Alien Enemies Act is part of this. It's unclear what the effect will be on public opinion going forward. But as one Democratic voter told the Washington Post: "At some point you've got to be like, 'We've got this issue. Trump's handling it.' The PTA Chairman Muhammad Altaf claimed that the drop in legal imports had resulted in a revenue loss of Rs3.23 billion in the last quarter of the Fiscal Year 2024. He further revealed that over the past eight months, illegal channels had diverted 29.67 million kilograms of tea, causing a loss of Rs13.84 billion to the national exchequer.

He commuted to South Africa for coaching duties since being appointed in January 2023. 

Ministry calls on US to release frozen funds

KABUL (Ariana News): The Ministry of Economy has called on the United States to release Afghanistan's frozen assets and return the funds to the country's central bank.

Abdul Latif Nazari, the Minister Deputy Economy, also urged the international community and other countries to lift banking sanctions and restrictions against Afghanistan and for continued humanitarian and developmental aid to help rebuild the country's infrastructure.

Afghanistan has been experiencing an economic crisis for more than three and a half years, with many citizens facing dire financial conditions.

This crisis is largely attributed to the freezing of Afghanistan's central bank assets by the US and the international community's banking sanctions on the

country.
While criticizing the continuation of these pressures, calls on the US to Afghanistan's release frozen assets and hand them over to the country's central bank have continued to be made.

Abdul Latif Nazari, the Minister of Economy, also emphasized the importance of rebuilding Afghanistan's infrastructure and urged the international community to support Afghanistan through sustained humanitarian and developmental assistance.

Meanwhile, believe that Afghanistan's assets are released and economic and banking sanctions are lifted, it could help the country emerge from its economic crisis and improve its

financial situation. This comes after the Islamic Emirate took power in Afghanistan, prompting the United States to freeze more than \$9.5 billion of the country's central bank reserves.

Currently, another \$3.5 billion remains frozen in US banks, while over \$2 billion is held in banks in Europe and the United

JERUSALEM (AP): Israel's military oper- tion," said the forum, which called on the ation in the Gaza Strip is expanding to seize "large areas," the defense minister Palestinian territory said Israeli strikes overnight and into Wednesday had killed more than 30 people, nearly a dozen of them children.

Israel's offensive in the Palestinian territory was "expanding to crush and clean the area" of militants and "seizing large areas that will be added to the security zones of the State of Israel," Defense Minister Israel Katz said in a written statement. The Israeli government has long maintained a buffer zone just inside Gaza along its security fence and has greatly expanded since the war began in 2023. Israel says the buffer zone is needed for its security, while Palestinians view it as a land grab that further shrinks the narrow coastal territory, home to around 2 million people.

Katz didn't specify which areas of Gaza would be seized in the expanded operation, which he said includes the "extensive evacuation" of the population from fighting areas. His statement came after Israel ordered the full evacuation of the southern city of Rafah and nearby areas. Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has said Israel aims to maintain an open-ended but unspecified security control of the Gaza Strip once it achieves its aim of crushing

The minister called on Gaza residents to 'expel Hamas and return all hostages." The militant group still holds 59 captives, of whom 24 are believed to still be alive, after most of the rest were released in ceasefire agreements or other deals. "This is the only way to end the war," Katz said.

The Hostage Families Forum, which represents most captives' families, said that it was "horrified to wake up this morning to the Defense Minister's announcement about expanding military operations in Gaza." The group said the Israeli government "has an obligation to free all 59 hostages from Hamas captivity — to pursue every possible channel to advance a deal for their release." They stressed that every passing day puts their loved ones' lives at greater risk.

Later Wednesday officials at the Indonesian Hospital said ar Israeli strike on a building of the UN agency for Palestinian refugees, or UNRWA, in the Jabaliya refugee camp in the northern Gaza Strip killed 15 people, including nine children and two women.

Juliette Touma, a spokeswoman for UNRWA, confirmed that an UNRWA building had been hit, but did not have any further details on casualties or what the building was being used as. The Palestinian Civil Defense said the building had been an UNRWA clinic that was now being used to house displaced people. It said the attack hit two rooms in the building, and that it evacuated the bodies of seven of those killed as well as 12 people who were wounded.

The Israeli military said it struck Hamas members in the area, adding that they were hiding inside "a command and control center that was being used for coordinating" armed activity and served as a central meeting point for the Palestinian group. The war began when Hamas-led militants attacked southern Israel on Oct. 7, 2023 killing around 1,200 people, mostly civilians, and taking 251 hostages. Israel's offensive has killed more than 50,000 Palestinians, including hundreds killed in strikes since a ceasefire ended about two weeks ago, according to Gaza's Health Ministry, which doesn't say whether those

US approves sale of 20 F-16 fighter to Philippines

US attacks kill 4 in Yemen

attacks by the United States on Yemen's Hodeidah region, the latest deadly strikes against Houthi forces as the US announced the deployment of a second aircraft carrier and more warplanes to the Middle East. Anees Alasbahi, a spokesman for the Houthi health minister, said three people were confirmed killed in the US attack night but that the death toll was preliminary.

"The American attack, which targeted the water management building in the district of al-Mansouriyah in the governorate of Hodeidah with several strikes on Tuesday resulted in three deaths and two injuries, mostly employees," Alasbahi said. The Houthi-affiliated Masirah TV later reported that the death toll had risen to four. Local media reported that the Hajjah region in the northwest and Saada in the north had also been attacked.

The US has not confirmed that it carried out the attacks, which came after Al Masirah TV reported multiple US attacks hitting the Saada and Sanaa regions. There were no immediate reports of casualties from the Monday night attacks. More than 60 people have been killed in Yemen since Washington launched a military offensive on March 15 against Houthi forces. The Yemeni armed group had threatened to renew attacking Israelilinked shipping in the Red Sea in response to Israel's breaking of the ceasefire in

Gaza.
