India would Fail to weaponize the FATF this time

INCE facing the fury of Operation Bunyan Marsoos and seeing the folly of instigating kinetic conflict against Pakistan, India has been looking towards alternative means of harming Pakistan. It has mentioned various global financial instruments as an alternate domain of warfare, but so far its efforts have fallen on deaf ears. For example, the IMF rejected India's appeal to withhold the most recent tranche of the ongoing Extended Fund Facility. Next, India may look to the Financial Action Task Force (FATF) and attempt to weaponize it, as it did

By India's own admission, specifically that of its now domestically-reviled Externa Affairs Minister Jaishankar, India used the FATF as an instrument of coercion against Pakistan. The FATF put Pakistan on the "grey list" in 2018, as it is commonly known at the behest of India, and a long list of action items was imposed on Pakistan with threat of sanctions under non-compliance. In response, Pakistan undertook a twopronged approach to exit the grey list.

First, Pakistan seriously pursued the AML/CFT (anti-money laundering / countering financing of terrorists) measures stipulated by the FATF, and ended up with an impressive, integrated financial oversight regime in the process. This involved a multistake holder and meticulous whole-of-government approach. To its credit, Pakistan exited the list with standards higher than developing countries and comparable to those of some developed countries, vowing never again to end up on the grey list.

Second, Pakistan pushed back on many international fora, including the United Nations, against the FATF, openly decrying its hypocrisy and duplicity as a task force. After all, if one really cared about AML/CFT, wouldn't one target all the offshore tax havens of the world? Better yet, the onshore havens such as London, Delaware Guernsey, or Miami? More specifically, whether the FATF cares to admit it or not, India violates all of the areas under the FATF's self-ascribed purview. India finances terrorism in many countries, it has a massive black economy fueled by money laundering and it even has sensitive nuclear material found in briefcases. Jaishankar's India belongs not simply on the grey list, but at the bottom of the black list. All in all, Pakistan's push back against the FATF put the task force itself on the defensive, raising questions around the world regarding the competence, impartiality, and neutrality of what increasingly appeared to be a highly toxic self-appointed financial watchdog.

As such, any Indian push to have Pakistan re-listed on the FATF is unlikely to work à la 2018. New Delhi's long-standing strategy of lawfare and abusing international financial governance appears unsustainable. The three reasons that Jaishankar and other hardline manipulators should desist from trying to weaponize the FATF again include the FATF's own reputational decline, Pakistan's technical compliance, and India's polit ical miscalculations.

First, Pakistan has already exposed FATF's political vulnerabilities since 2018 by framing the grey listing as a politically motivated move rather than a merely technical one. This has weakened FATF's image as a neutral arbiter, and it is now more cautious. aware that overplaying political influence risks further damage to its credibility among Global South nations that increasingly view the body as biased.

Second, Pakistan has implemented the vast majority of action points mandated by FATF, positioning itself as an exemplar in technical compliance for a developing country. Any attempt to re-list Pakistan would lack a defensible technical basis, making FATF vulnerable to accusations of double standards, further eroding its legitimacy.

Third, Indian officials such as Jaishankar have already played their hand by publicly admitting to lobbying to keep Pakistan on the grey list as part of India's strategic agenda. When Pahalgam's tensions began to fume, mainstream (Godi) media and social media openly echoed such weaponization. But such open politicization undermines the viability of an Indian campaign, signaling to FATF members that this is less about technical compliance and more about geopolitical rivalry. Such transparency about intent reduces the likelihood of building a credible coalition within FATF for re-listing

As such, an Indian attempt to weaponize the FATF is unlikely to succeed given FATF's damaged reputation, Pakistan's demonstrated compliance, and India's own diplomatic errors. Moving forward, the effectiveness of FATF as a neutral body depends on insulating it from geopolitical manipulation. Both FATF and its member states must prioritize technical integrity over political agendas if they are to retain rel evance in the global financial governance landscape.

Taskforce reports decline in poliovirus

Home

AHORE (APP): The Taskforce Eradication in Punjab has hailed a notable decline in poliovirus detection in environmental samples across the province, urging authorities to maintain targeted measures to sustain progress. The announcement came during a meeting held on Friday at the Civil Secretariat, where officials reviewed recent advancements in the fight against polio. The taskforce

briefed on the success of the April polio immunizacampaign, achieved an impressive 98 percent coverage rate. The meeting, chaired by Punjab Health Minister Khawaja Imran Nazir, was attended by Chief Secretary Zahid Akhtar Zaman, Minister's Focal Person for Polio Eradication Uzma Kardar, secretaries of the home and health departments, and representatives from international organizations supporting polio eradication. All divisional and deputy commissioners participated via video link.

Health Minister Nazir reaffirmed the provincial government's commitment to eradicating polio under Chief Minister Maryam Nawaz's leadership. He praised the health department, commissioners, and deputy commissioners for their role in the successful April campaign, noting that targeted strategies for mobile populations and previously missed children were pivotal to its success.

Chief Secretary Zaman emphasized the challenges of conducting polio campaigns during the summer, particularly the need to maintain the vaccine cold chain. With the next campaign set to begin on May 26, he directed the Home Department to ensure robust security for transit vaccination teams.

International organization representatives commended Punjab's efforts in reducing poliovirus transmission. Health department officials confirmed that the upcoming campaign will run from May 26 to June 1 in Lahore, Faisalabad, and Rawalpindi, and conclude on May 30 in other districts.

committee reviews security arrangements Association Ameeruddin LAHORE (APP): The President Pakistan Netball Mudassar Secretary Throwball of the Cabinet Committee

Punjab Home Department convened the 28th meeting on Law and Order, chaired Provincial Health Minister and Committee Chairman Salman Rafique. The session focused on upcoming security measures for Eidul-Adha, the Sialkot byelections on June 1, remaining Pakistan Super League (PSL) matches and the Pakistan-Bangladesh cricket series.

According spokesperson for the Home Department, Provincial Ministers Syed Ashiq Hussain Kirmani and Bilal Akbar Khan attended in person, while Law Minister Muhammad Sohaib Ahmed Bharath participated via video link. The meeting included a detailed review of the province's law and order situation, with a briefing by Punjab Home Secretary Noor-ul-Amin Mengal High-ranking officials from law enforcement agencies, including Additional IG Punjab Chaudhry Sultan, Special Secretary Fazal ur Rehman, Special Branch and CTD also participated, along with commissioners, deputy commissioners, RPOs and DPOs from across Punjab via video link.

The committee strongly condemned the recent terrorist attack on a school bus carrying children in Khuzdar, calling it a cowardly act. Instructions were issued for foolproof security arrangements during Eid-ul-Adha, with a specific directive that only registered organisations would be allowed to collect animal hides. A strict ban was reaffirmed on hide collection by any unregistered or illegal groups. The same emphasis on stringent security was placed on the upcoming by-elections in Sialkot and remaining PSL matches, added spokesperson.

The committee approved Rs 105 million for the establishment of Automated Extraction System at the Punjab Forensic Science Agency and sanctioned the creation of seven new police stations across various districts to enhance local law enforcement capabilities.

GENEVA (Reuters): The Palestinian health minister said that 29 children and elderly people had died from starvation-related deaths in Gaza in recent days and that many thousands more were at risk. Food aid is expected to start reaching Gazans after Israel let the first trucks through following an 11blockade, week Palestinian and aid officials say it is just a fraction of what is needed.

"In the last couple of days lost 29 children,' Palestinian Health Minister Majed Abu Ramadan told reporters, describing them as 'starvation-related deaths". He later clarified that the total included elderly people as well as children. Asked to react to earlier comments by the UN aid chief to the BBC that 14,000 babies could die without aid, he said: "The number 14,000 is very realistic may be even underestimating (the scale)." Israel imposed the blockade on all supplies in March, saying Hamas was seizing deliveries for its fighters - a charge the group denies. Earlier this month, a global hunger monitor said that half a million people in the Gaza Strip face starvation.

Abu Ramadan said that only seven or eight hospitals out of Gaza's 36 were partially functioning, and that more than 90% of medical stocks were now at zero due to the blockade. "My information is that very few shipments went inside Gaza 90-100 truck loads and in the south and mid zones." Asked if there are any medical supplies among them, he said: "As far as I know ..it's only flour for bak-

Abbas, Aoun back arms under state control

BEIRUT (AFP): Lebanese President Joseph Aoun and Palestinian leader Mahmud Abbas met in Beirut and backed placing all weapons under Lebanese state control, as they discussed efforts to disarm armed groups in Palestinian refugee camps.

A joint statement from the Lebanese presidency said the two leaders shared the "belief questioned Bernie's claim that the era of weapons outside Lebanese state control has ended" and backed the principle that arms should be held exclusively by the state. Abbas's three-day trip is his first to Lebanon since 2017. The country hosts about

222,000 Palestinian refugees, according to the United Nations agency UNRWA, many living in overcrowded camps beyond state control. A Lebanese government source said Abbas's visit aimed to set up a mechanism to remove weapons from the camps. The source requested anonymity as they were not allowed to brief the media. The statement said the two sides agreed "to form a joint Lebanese-Palestinian committee to follow up on the situation of Palestinian camps in Lebanon and work on improving the living conditions of refugees, while respecting Lebanese sover-

eignty and committing to Lebanese laws" By longstanding convention, the Lebanese army stays out of the Palestinian camps. where Abbas's Fatah, its rival Hamas and other armed handle security. groups Hamas claimed attacks on Israel from Lebanon during more than a year of hostilities involving its Lebanese ally Hezbollah. The clashes, sparked by the Gaza war, largely subsided after a truce in November. "The monopoly of weapons should be in the hands of the state," Aoun said in an interview with Egyptian channel ON TV.

The army, he added, had dismantled six Palestinian military training camps three in Bekaa, one south of Beirut and two in the north and seized weapons. Under the November ceasefire agreement, the army has also been dismantling militant group Hezbollah's infrastructure in the country's south. Ahmad Majdalani, a senior Liberation Palestine Organization official accompanying Abbas, said the visit came as Lebanon entered "a new era" in which it is receiving "Arab and American support". "What matters to us in this new regional context is that we do not become part of Lebanon's internal conflicts," he said, "and that the Palestinian cause is not exploited to serve any party.

On the one hand, even the smallest injustice should be taken into account and on the other hand, the biggest injustice should be ignored. Whether South Africa is committing oppression or any other state, it has no right to oppress anyone or deny anyone the right to live. The question is, is it only white people in South Africa who are being oppressed?

in Sudan along with deepening tensions Sudanese between the Armed Forces (SAF) and the paramilitary Rapid **Support** Forces group have brought the destructiveness of the civil war in the country to a critwhich has been going on has gone beyond the war between the two groups and has become so differdefined as a mere power struggle.

Analyses show that the Sudanese Army and the RSF continue operations in the civil war to gain military and legitimacy. However, during this period, the effects of the war have intensified across Sudan, from Nyala to Port Sudan. Furthermore, the increasing indirect influence of external actors such as the United Arab Emirates is clearly transforming the scope and nature of the war.

The RSF's consolidation of control in strategic locations such as Nyala and Kordofan in recent weeks and intense drone attacks on Port Sudan have created a structure that has changed the course of the civil war. The RSF's primary aim is to discredit the Sudanese army and the current administration, and it is understood that another aim is to establish a parallel civilian government in Darfur. Indeed, the alliances recently declared in Nairobi, Kenya indicate the RSF's search for political legitimacy.

The recent attacks on Port conflict compared Khartoum, also reveal that Sudan's strategic infrastructure is being systematically targeted. The RSF's systematic and long-range drone attacks have changed the dynamics of the conflict on ground. How the Sudanese Army will respond to the RSF's air superiority remains a critical question.

In addition, it is a fact that

the humanitarian crisis in Sudan continues devastatingly. Power outages, water supply disruptions and health infrastructure collapse have increased disease risk and malnutrition, especially among children. A key factor reinforcing the transformation in the nature of this conflict is the growing involvement of regional actors. The aid. On the contrary, they have assumed a role that directly shapes the military and political landscape on the ground. Among these actors, the UAE stands out due to the scope and nature of its engagement in Sudan. The UAE's role in Sudan

is often interpreted, across various sources, as an extension of its strategic postures in Libya and Somalia. It is a well-documented fact that the UAE has channeled Sudanese gold to Abu Dhabi markets through its past economic and military ties with Mohamed leader Hamdan Dagalo, also known as Hemedti. In return, the UAE has supported the RSF with military equipment and financial aid. Open-source intelligence platforms like Flight Radar indicate the existence of an air bridge transporting weapons from the UAE to the Chad border and then into Darfur. At the same time, radar systems and bases recently established in Bosaso in Somalia's federal member state Puntland suggest that this supply line functions as a logistic support center in the east. These shadow supply chains not only prolong the conflict but also hinder Sudan, which are far from the peace efforts. In the context of the Sudan crisis, the response from the international community remains insufficient. Apart from occasional statements of condemnation by institutions like the United Nations, the African Union and the European Union, there have been no tangible efforts to disrupt the supply chains fueling the conflict.

While the Sudanese government has publicly accused the UAE and severed diplomatic ties, submitting the matter to the UN Security Council, this initiative has yet to translate into any meaningful international sanctions or legal proceedings. Today, the tragedy endured by Sudanese civilians is not just a result of internal conflict. It is also a consequence of proxy warinfluence of these actors is no fare, regional power rivalries longer limited to diplomatic and international silence. A public outcry put a stop to the authorities' plan to install a mosaic depicting Stalin and Putin as military leaders. Nonetheless, a significant part of Russian society seems to see Stalin as a charismatic godfather





Ending their G7 meeting in the Canadian Rocky Mountains, where foreign ministers were also convening this week, the finance chiefs said that if efforts to end Russia's "continued brutal war" in Ukraine failed, the group would look at how it could push Moscow to step back. "If such a ceasefire is

not agreed, we will continue to explore all possible options, including options to maximise pressure such as further ramping up sanctions," a final communique following three days of meetings read. The G7, comprised of Canada, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, the United Kingdom, and the United States, also pledged to work together to ensure that no countries that financed the war would be eligible to benefit from Kyiv's reconstruction.

Canadian Finance Minister Francois-Philippe Champagne said that point was a "very big statement", calling it a key pillar. However, the group shied away from naming countries, including China, which the West has previously accused of supplying weapons to Russia.

The communique added that Russia's sovereign assets in G7 jurisdictions would continue to be blocked until Moscow ended the war and paid reparations to Ukraine for the damage it caused to the country. "I think it sends a very clear signal to the Champagne told the closing news confer-

He said there have been 4,664 terrorist incidents across Pakistan, with 1,612 occurring in Balochistan. Security forces have conducted 93,515 counter-terrorism operations nationwide, including 52,887 in Balochistan, he added. He added that in 2024, security forces killed 1,018 terrorists across the country, including 233 in Balochistan.
